Approval of Minutes – Scott/Eric made a motion to approve December 19, 2017 council minutes. (Motion Approved)

Consent Agenda – Matt/Mary made a motion to approve the December 2017 Treasurer's Reports, Pastors' Reports, and Attendance Report. (Motion Approved)

Pastor's Report – Pastor Trish updated that the Club 9 retreat is this weekend.

Treasurer's Report – A continued story of good news! Net income at 12/31/17 is \$66,591, considerably over our budget of \$24,115, and prior year net income at this point of \$35,753. Pledged giving for the month of December was almost \$24,000 over budget, bringing our year-to-date pledged giving at 12/31/17 (6 months) to \$396,000, about \$27,000 over budget. Non-pledged giving for the month was also up, almost \$18,000 over budget, bringing our year-to-date non-pledged giving at 12/31/17 (6 months) to \$79,000, about \$14,000 over budget. All other income categories were within a small range of the budgeted numbers. Overall, total income YTD at 12/31/17 was \$520,830 – considerably above our budget of \$480,000 due to the giving variances above! We are also above where we were last year at this time (12/31/16), which was \$500,000 in income.

Attendance Report – Discussed worship attendance, including holiday services.

Council Priority Topic – Homeless shelter, week of Jan. 28 – CTK was asked to fill in for one week for the rotating homeless shelter. We have agreed to the week of Jan. 28, which will have the least impact on our Wednesday night education program due to a Faith in Motion activity. Volunteers have come forward to assist with the necessary duties.

Old Business -

- Stewardship Mission Team update 6-7 people have been identified so far to participate in a series of 8 videos to be shown before and during the pledge drive time. Two videos have been completed so far. Next meeting is January 24th.
- Financial Audit Update In progress, no update
- Lectionary Study a new weekly bible study has been started at 8:45 a.m.

New Business – Commission Roles and Tactics – positive feedback from the commissions. Suggestion to share commission minutes with all other commissions, not just Council. Possible retreat for all council members and all commission members in August. Commissions to identify how many additional members they are looking for and what talents they are looking for.

Pastoral Report

CTK Ministries 2018 February Senior Pastor's Report – Pastor Patrick Patterson

Administrative

- *Financials* with the vacancy in the financial administrator position (see Personnel section below), I am working with CTK treasurer Katie Wayne, an outside accounting resource, and our church software company (ACS Technologies) to facilitate end of month procedures, and will distribute January financial results once they're available.
- Pastor-to-Pastor Continuing Ed I will be participating in the Pastor-to-Pastor continuing education retreat at Gustavus on February 15 and 16. This is my third year of participation in this clergy group that meets as a whole three times annually, and multiple times in smaller colleague groups. I have also agreed to serve on the board for this collaborative effort of Gustavus, the Southwestern MN Synod and our Southeastern MN Synod.
- Stewardship Mission Team the first Power of the Pledge Moment video was well received during worship services last week and we will have a new video for each of the next seven weeks. We plan to launch the official pledge drive on Saturday, February 24 and run the pledge drive until Palm Sunday, March 24 when we request that all pledges be turned in by members. Follow up will be conducted after that date with non-pledgers to ensure the broadest participation possible. While the CLUB 360 concept will be introduced during this time, the other two strategies will be launched later. In order to accommodate the volume of inviting all members with a gift of record to a thank you event, it's necessary to wait until the weather warms up to holds some activities outdoors. The strategy with inconsistent giving is still being worked out. The next mission team meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, February 13.

Personnel

- Financial Administrator Vacancy the personnel committee is working with our Treasurer and me to respond to our short term and longer-term solutions to our financial management needs upon the separation of our financial administrator on Feb. 5, 2018. We will also look at staff development efforts as we move forward.
- *Annual reviews* annual reviews with all staff members were completed in January. The new qualitative conversation format was well received and produced helpful discussion.

Facilities

• *Public Safety Training* – the Mankato police offered a public safety training course for houses of worship that focused on prevention of risk and reaction to active shooter situations in congregations. Rick participated in the training.

Proclaim Commission

• *New Members* – the commission would like to see three or more new members. It would be especially helpful to have folks with communications, journalism, web, social media or marketing interest or expertise.

Justice & Peace Commission

• Re-usable bags – one idea arising from our Pridefest participation has been to produce branded reusable bags to promote the CTK J&P message in our community. The design is being developed and costs researched to make the bags available for members as well as at the annual festival.

Word & Sacrament Commission

• Lenten Worship – Ash Wednesday on Feb. 14 will mark the beginning of our Lenten Wednesday worship schedule with worship services at 4:45PM and 6:15PM. We will again have the round-robin preaching schedule with other ELCA pastors under the theme of Sabbath.

Pastoral Report

CTK Ministries 2018 February Associate Pastor's Report – Pastor Trish Reedstrom

Worship:

- We had another Faith in Motion worship service at the end of January. A thank you to Kathy Brozik, Lisa Brozik, and Jen Anderson for helping to tell the story of Ruth for children (young and old). Wednesday evening attendance was disappointing; we assume without an education hour on that night that many families choose to stay home. We are discussing doing the FIM worship service on the last night of the rotation instead of the "week in-between" so that more families are present. There is one more service that will happen for this program year in May.
- Otherwise, we are busy planning for Lent worship opportunities!

Pastoral Care:

• Our week of hosting the homeless shelter saw a good turn-out in terms of numbers of volunteers, and positive comments from the guests. A HUGE thank you to John Love for all the work that he did in helping to coordinate the week and run interference for the communication difficulties that happened during the week. Any difficulties we had were "behind the scenes" and due to a variety of issues, like it was our first time, the shelter manager was new, etc. I've gotten email input from a number of people who volunteered and they would do it again. At the time of this writing, I still need to connect with the shelter manager to confirm if there is any need for the rest of the season, and what that might look like. An additional week would be more difficult, but perhaps not impossible, due to Wednesday night programming. If I have more info I will bring it to council.

Education and Youth:

- CLUB 9 retreat was very successful, with 27 out of 30 youth participating. We are continuing the preparation work toward Affirmation of Baptism in May. This will include trying a Sunday (the week before) lunch and time of celebration as opposed to the Saturday (day before) brunch to see if we get better turn-out. One of the upcoming events for this spring for CLUB9 is a "Money Matters" workshop for parents and youth.
- Just beginning planning with a small group for a women's retreat this fall.
- Lectionary study on Thursday mornings is going well.

Continuing Education

• I have completed my First Call Theological Education this month, and am beginning the SHAPE Leadership program for the coming year.

Commissions

- Faithful People recommends that there be 8 people on their commission. They are interested in members who like to plan FUN! events. That includes brainstorming new ideas, and then planning/coordinating/recruiting help. They would also suggest an every other month with email communication in-between. An annual plan would be developed, members would take an activity to lead, and the year would then run smoothly....
- The Servant Commission recommends 7 or 8 people be a part of that commission. They would want people who can make the date/time of that particular meeting, and who would be willing to take on the projects of the commission.

Summary of Key Items discussed at meeting:

- Minnesota Interfaith Power & Light: We had Briana Baker from MN Interfaith Power & Light come and speak with us about their organization and how Christ the King could work with them. Their current initiative is the Community Solar Garden. We have agreed to spread the word about their forum at the public library on February 20th and to sponsor an adult forum for her to share about their organization and the solar garden. Date for the adult forum is TBD.
- J&P Commission Focus: We discussed the council's request to provide feedback on the # of people desired for the commission and specific roles we need filled. We agreed to 5-6 total members in addition to the council & pastor liaisons. This means we are in need of three additional members currently. As far as specific needs we would like to have a more demographically diverse membership (men, women, ethnicity, ages) with people passionate about a wide range of injustices (current events, mental health, LGBT, environmental, racial inequity, religious inequity, economic inequity, homelessness).
- Mankato Zero Waste: The Zero Waste adult forum has been rescheduled for 3/4/18 at 9:30. Kate has shared a blurb with Devin to put in the Good News. The plan is still to have some sample bags for CTK members to try composting and allow the use of CTK compost dumpster as a drop-off site.
- Reusable Bag Sale: Kate came up with some fantastic designs and Emma got us our first quote for a basic reusable grocery bag. We are going to look into the pricing for a bag that folds into itself, snaps shut and is easily carried in a purse or backpack as another option. There is some talk of using these bags for gifts within the congregation as well. Next meeting we will try and finalize our plan & purchase of the bags.
- ISAIAH Faith in Democracy: Patrick is going to reach out to ISAIAH to see if they can come to our March meeting.
