### A Word from Our Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

GOD DOES NOT GIVE GIFTS! These were the words delivered by one of the keynote speakers during the Kaleidoscope Stewardship Conference I attended in September. Needless to say, they were words that caught my attention since they are so counter to my beliefs. They were the words of Rev. Chick Lane, a Lutheran pastor who had just finished making the point that all we have belongs to God.

Gifts, he said, are given without expectation of return. For example, when you give a birthday gift, you give it to the person and expect nothing in return. Rev. Lane made the point, that all we have belongs to God but these are not gifts to do with only as we wish. We are stewards of what we have. We take care of what God has given us on behalf of God. So, our homes, cars and money are really from God, to take care of and to consider, what God wants done with them. The question is not what do I want to do with all that I have, but what does God want me to do with all I have?



In Falling Upward, the book our church is reading together by Richard Rohr, he points out in the first half of life one of our concerns is financial security. In the second half of life we move beyond worrying about such things and begin to let go of the need to worry about "stuff". Wouldn't it be freeing if we could learn early in life that everything we have belongs to God and we are simply to manage it for God? Rather than worry about accumulating we could turn our attention to the joy of how best to use our possessions for the good of others.

I still believe God gives us all kinds of gifts with no strings attached. Grace certainly comes to mind as does mercy and forgiveness. But the idea that our possessions in life belong to God and that we are merely stewards for God is certainly a faithful way to be set free from the meaningless pursuit of stuff!


### Advocacy
