Graham Hart has been the General Presbyter of Peace River Presbytery (southwest Florida) since 2001. Prior to being called to this work, Graham served as Pastor/Head of Staff of three congregations in Illinois, New Jersey and Nevada. Graham grew up in Doylestown, PA, began ministry as a "student intern minister" at Doylestown Presbyterian Church, and was ordained there in 1976.

Graham and his wife Linda, who teaches High School students, have three children and six grandchildren. Graham is a graduate of Wheaton College and Princeton Theological Seminary and has an advanced degree in church administration. He has received training from the Alban Institute, is a facilitator for the *Healthy Congregation Workshop*, is trained as a church conflict mediator, and is a Life-Leadership Coach trained by Auburn Seminary. workshops in congregations and other presbyteries on church growth, strategic planning, conflict resolution, and Appreciative Inquiry, and is a past-president of the Association of Executive Presbyters. Graham recently announced that he will retire in the spring of 2019.
