*Image: Christ the Redeemer, Paul Maximilien Landowski and Gheorghe Leonida, Statue, 1931. This massive statue, made of reinforced concrete and soapstone, was designed by French sculptor Paul Landowski and built by Brazilian engineer Heitor da Silva Costa, in collaboration with French engineer Albert Caquot. Romanian sculptor Gheorghe Leonida fashioned the face. Constructed between 1922 and 1931, the statue is 30 metres (98 ft) high, excluding its 8-metre (26 ft) pedestal. The arms stretch 28 metres (92 ft) wide. This statue of Jesus Christ located at the peak of the 2,300 ft Corcovado mountain overlooking the city of Rio de Janeiro is listed as one of the New Seven Wonders of the World.*
