


Letter from the Pastor

"What's our word?", I called out on Sunday, May 6, after Jonathan Nii and Kevin Conlee, chairs of the Capital Campaign announced the total raised so far: 1.5 million dollars in pledges and gifts. The Capital Campaign committee responded, "SHAZAM!"

It may be a word more common to comic book characters than Capital Campaign committees, but for us, it held our childlike awe at the generosity God is stirring up in our church. Several families made pledges at \$100,000 or more. One giver said he had decided to give \$20,000 but then he felt called to more than double his pledge. Shazam!

It's not just the pledges of large amounts that have moved me. Someone who told me she wouldn't be able to give to the campaign pledged \$500 a year for three years. Shazam! A couple with some financial concerns committed to a few dollars a month. "It's not a lot, but we wanted to be part of it," they said. Shazam! We received commitments from seniors on fixed incomes and from families raising kids. Shazam! We received commitments from people who are deeply involved in the life of our church and those on the periphery. Shazam!

This kind of generosity is evidence of the Holy Spirit at work among us. What might be our next Shazam moment? Where else will the Holy Spirit stretch us, push us and cause us to grow?

June Mission - United Methodist Global AIDS Fund



At the beginning of 2016, approximately 37 million people around the world were living with HIV or AIDS. Young people and particularly women are increasingly affected - nearly half of all AIDS patients are women. And each day, 700 babies are born HIV positive. Mother-to-child transmission of HIV (MTCT) can be reduced to below 5% when women have access to testing, counseling, and treatment. But access is often difficult.

The UMC Global AIDS Fund (UMGAF) began in 2004 as a response to the global AIDS pandemic. Grants are provided to global projects that provide education for prevention and/or care for those who are infected with HIV or AIDS. As of 2016, funding for 287 Christ-centered projects in 44 countries had been allocated plus scores of Annual Conference AIDS projects. Of the total money raised in each Annual Conference for UMGAF, 25 percent shall be retained by the Annual Conference for programs combating HIV & AIDS in their region and/or in other global connectional projects. Advocacy for prevention, care and treatment has been a consistent focus of UMGAF through its partnership with the General Board of Church and Society which administers the AIDS Network in The UMC. The face of AIDS is changing in the world. More persons have access to life saving drugs which is reducing the number of overall deaths. But stigma inflicted by the Church and society keeps people from being tested and treated. UMGAF is the official entity in The United Methodist Church working to create an AIDS-free.

The goals of the UMGAF are: the prevention of mother-to-child transmission of HIV; the prevention of HIV in young people and high-risk populations; increased access to HIV counseling, testing, and treatment services; and stigma reduction and psychosocial support to people living with HIV. Les Misérables - July 8

The July 8 service will feature songs from Les Miserables.

Les Miserables is a sung-through musical based on the novel, Les Misérables by French poet and novelist Victor Hugo. Premiering in Paris in 1980, it has music by Claude-Michel Schönberg and original French-language lyrics by Alain Boublil and Jean-Marc Natel, alongside an English-language libretto with accompanying English-language lyrics by Herbert Kretzmer.

Set in early 19th-century France, it is the story of Jean Valjean, a French peasant, and his quest for redemption after serving nineteen years in jail for having stolen a loaf of bread for his sister's starving child. Valjean decides to break his parole and start his life anew after a kindly bishop inspires him by a tremendous act of mercy, but he is relentlessly tracked down by a police inspector named Javert. Along the way, Valjean and a slew of characters are swept into a revolutionary period in France, where a group of young idealists make their last stand at a street barricade. Pastor Melissa Earley will be preaching at this service.

Moana - July 15

The July 15 service will feature songs from the 2016 animated Disney movie, "Moana".

The film features songs written by Lin-Manuel Miranda (Hamilton composer) and Opetaia Foa'i, and orchestral score composed by Mark Mancina.

The film tells the story of Moana, the strong-willed daughter of a chief of a Polynesian village, who is chosen by the ocean itself to reunite a mystical relic with a goddess. When a blight strikes her island, Moana sets sail in search of Maui, a legendary demigod, in the hope of returning the heart of Te Fiti and saving her people. Liz Evans will be preaching at this service.
