Search Committee Update

With all of the glorious celebrations of Terry's ministry behind us, your Search Committee is moving forward in the process leading to our next rector. We are very fortunate to have a group of dedicated parishioners who represent the breadth of St. Matthew's and who are committed to securing a rector who will build on Terry's foundation and lead us to continuing growth as a Christian community. We are all aware of the importance of this task and embark with the realization that a successful search is one directed by the Holy Spirit. On May 16 the Vestry delivered its formal charge to the Search Committee.

We had an initial meeting of the Committee on May 25th to discuss the process, the roles of members of the Committee and the importance of confidentiality throughout our efforts. We are working on formulating a budget and a timetable for the various stages of the process. We have established two work streams: one to prepare the parish survey questionnaire and the other to commence work on the narrative portion of the Parish Profile.

The two work streams will move forward in parallel over the summer with the goal of having the questionnaire out to the parish in early September as we start the new church year. We will be asking every parishioner for your thoughtful and prayerful attention to the questionnaire. The Parish Profile, which will be informed by the questionnaire responses, is vitally important in that it will serve as the introduction of St. Matthew's to potential candidates. Your views are critical to create a profile that fully reflects who we are as a parish and what we are looking for in our next rector. When completed in the fall, the results of the survey and the Parish Profile will be shared with the parish.

On June 22 the Search Committee met with Rev. Canon Deborah Tammearu, Canon for Transition Ministry, to discuss the support resources available from the Diocesan Deployment Office.

The committee will be active throughout the process and we will provide regular updates through the Key and on the Church website. We welcome your comments and suggestions - including candidate suggestions. We do however ask for your understanding that the necessary confidentiality of the search process will very strictly constrain each of us serving on the committee from discussing anything beyond the information in these process updates.



During Terry's final service on June 11th, the students sang his favorite children's song, The Church in the Wildwood. Terry then proceeded to tell the story of a gnome trapped in the church that may be released during church construction. The mysterious foretelling of an appearance leaves children and parishioners guessing. During the children's service, Attendance Awards were distributed. As we collected our final service sheets for the year, students ran down the path for the annual Stream Stomp and returned for a spectacular coffee hour hosted by Diana Saunders' team.

We had ideal weather for the church picnic, warm and sunny. The children tossed bean bags made by the MacLean family, and filled water balloons that served as a respite from the heat. A framed multi-media depiction of the Children's Chapel was



presented to Terry, a gift from the Church School students. During class time in May, the children colored in an 18" x 24" sketch and pasted pebbles, leaves, pressed flowers and bark from the church grounds to create a lively depiction.
