

Highlights from 2019

- YTD net income \$20,224 vs. budget of \$1,812
- 2019 Pledges – 98% collection rate
- Endowment fund balance as of December 31, 2019 year-end was \$6.5M up from \$5.8M in 2018
- Capital expenditures in 2019 were \$156,000 and included upgrades to the exterior building, air conditioner replacements, and interior improvements such as new carpeting and phone system
- 2019 Financial Review by an independent auditor will begin in July 2020

2020 Budget

- The church is closely monitoring the impact of COVID-19 on income and expenditures
- The annual budgeted expense estimate was \$2.4M, however due to the effects of COVID-19 and unclear economic conditions, 2020 financial plans will be revised on an as-needed basis
 - ◊ Offerings have remained strong through the generosity of our donors
 - ◊ Expense controls are in place. Capital expenditures have either been postponed until 2021 or are on hold until further notice.

Strategic Direction

Gary Root, Strategic Direction Team facilitator

Highlights

Late 2018

Session approved the establishment of a team to develop and propose a Mission Statement, Vision Statement, and 3-5 long-term objectives for FPC Naples.
Formed a large team of leaders from Session committees, church organizations, and church staff.

January – April 2019

Major focus on Mission Statement (i.e., “what is our purpose?”). Eight meetings averaging around 30 people per meeting.
Thorough discussion and agreement of SWOT analysis (strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, threats) as base from which to begin.
Evolution of our Mission Statement, always trying to discern God’s will for our church (i.e., “would God bless our purpose?”).
Incorporation of four key action verbs into our well-loved phrase, “In the Heart of Naples, with the Love of God.”
Unanimous approval by the Strategic Direction team, and by Session.
Presented to the congregation on May 5, 2019:

“In the Heart of Naples, with the Love of God: we worship, we love, we grow, we serve.”

Initial work on the Vision Statement was begun.

No further work was completed for the balance of 2019.

Thank you to all who served and worked hard on this assignment. We have some amazing people in this church. Work on the Vision Statement has resumed.

The Personnel Committee provides for the administration of the program of the church, including employment of non-ordained staff.

Highlights from 2019:

- The Human Resources Handbook for Staff was reviewed, updated and adopted.
- Patty Rutzler resigned from the committee after faithfully serving for several years.
- Chuck Work and Barbara Weiss joined the committee.
- Departure of staff members in 2019 included: Nickie Hannula, Kristen Lucas, Liz Psota.
- New members joining the staff in 2019 included: Angela Johnson, Maria Huffman, Lindsay Willkomm, Jack Fogelman, Audrey Gordon.
- Employee annual reviews were conducted to include the pastors goals and objectives.
- The Staff held a one day retreat at Rev. Goodrich's home, doing calendar planning, games, team building and small group exercises.
- Several staff members, including the pastors, attended continuing education courses within their line of work.
- An unpaid position of a Summer intern in 2020 was approved for the Christian Education department.
- Job descriptions for the Nursery Care Provider, Parent's Night Out and Sunday School Teacher were reviewed and updated.
- The job position for the Preschool Administrative Assistant was updated and renamed to Assistant Director of Preschool.
- The committee and Session approved a sabbatical leave for Dr. Brice Gerlach

Congregational Care

Shirley Hagerson, Elder for Congregational Care

This committee is composed of the Elder for Congregational Care, the Stephen Minister leader, the head of the Care Visitation team and the Deacon moderator.

There are 14 active Stephen Ministers who visit hospitalized members daily and assist those members in need. The Care Visitation Team consists of nine members and sees those who are in Care Facilities, and/or are homebound.

We visit, make phone calls, and send cards of encouragement. We are here to help.

Deacons

Teresa W. Doane, Moderator, Board of Deacons

During 2019, thirty deacons strived to nurture the congregation with compassion, service, and witness. The ministry of the deacons included numerous activities during the year.

- Coordinated the Greeter schedule and trained new Greeters.
- Planned and supported receptions and events including memorial services, Meet Your Deacon Sunday, Deacon Brunch, and the Blue Christmas service.
- Encouraged donations to St. Vincent de Paul, The Salvation Army, and Help's Outreach by coordinating the giving through the Deacon Fund on Communion Sundays using the pink envelopes.
- Participated in the preparation and serving of communion, including communion to the homebound.
- Welcomed new members through New Member Connect, offering tours and information about church activities and events.
- Visited parishioners recovering from illness and those celebrating milestone birthdays with flowers from the Chancel and shut-ins at Easter and Christmas with holiday remembrances.

The Board of Deacons meets monthly to enjoy fellowship with each other, discuss the life of the church, and share ideas to connect more fully with our faith and church family. Once you are a deacon, you are a deacon for life ministering to others with compassion.

Thanks to your generosity, many people in our community, nation, and beyond have been touched. On your behalf, the Missions Committee was able to support the following agencies.

- **On the local and national front:** Grace Place (\$2,000), Guadalupe Center (\$3,000), Habitat for Humanity (\$3,000), Helps Outreach (\$2,000), Immokalee Fair Housing Alliance (\$3,500), Lighthouse of Collier (\$2,000), Mision Peniel (\$3,500), Neighborhood Health Clinic (\$2,000), Pathways Education Center of Immokalee (\$2,000), St. Matthew's House (\$3,000), Shelter for Abused Women and Children (\$2000), Columbia Seminary in honor of Craig Goodrich (\$500), and Union Presbyterian Seminary in honor of Rex Childs. (\$500) Through the Christmas Eve offering, the ingredients and supplies for our Meals of Hope packing event were funded (\$9,000). **Internationally:** Central Presbyterian Church in Matanzas, Cuba and the Matanzas, Cuba Presbytery Youth Programs (\$6,000), Kemper Seminary Scholarships (\$3,000), World Vision WASH Program in Honduras (\$6,000), and Presbyterian Mission Worker Dori Hjalmarson, serving in Honduras. (\$6,000)
- **Through special collections and donations,** we were able to distribute \$1,100 to local Food Pantries, provide \$7,039 in Hurricane Relief, send \$3,438 for One Great Hour of Sharing, buy food for the Weekend Power Packs (\$1,798) and contributed \$8,348 to Feed the 5,000. Additionally, 130 school uniforms were provided for 130 children associated with the Shelter for Abused Women and Children, 150 children at Mision Peniel received new clothing from our Christmas Angels, work clothes were collected for the adults at Mision Peniel, children's books for Grace Place, and countless bags of groceries collected monthly for Feed the 5,000 to restock local food pantries.
- **Close to 800 volunteer hours** were provided to our local agencies through participation in Habitat for Humanity Work Days, serving in Immokalee at Mision Peniel, shopping for, assembling and delivering Weekend Power Food Packs to Big Cypress Elementary School, staffing our annual Meals of Hope event, helping out at Grace Place Literacy Day, cooking and serving meals at St. Matthew's House and ringing the bell for Salvation Army at Christmastime.
- **Highlights:**
 - World Vision's Dr. Allgood spoke to us about the WASH Program we support in Honduras, and Larry Comstock and Bernie Anderson presented an additional program on the impact of and important work being accomplished by World Vision.
 - We hosted the two pastors, Ary Fernandez Alban and Beidy Casas Aragon, from our partner church in Cuba. They provided us with a very interesting program, complete with slides, about their ministry in Matanzas. We sent funds back to Cuba with them for their Presbytery-wide youth events and programs, for their weekly senior lunch program food expenses, along with needed medicines and some church supplies, like communion cups and a set of handbells for their children's choir.
 - Dori Hjalmarson, the Presbyterian Mission Worker we support, visited and spoke at a Wednesday night dinner about her work in Honduras. She is providing much-needed theological education to Honduran pastors and church leaders.

The Missions Committee, on behalf of all those whose needs you have helped to meet, extends a deep and heartfelt thanks for your continued generosity, giving spirits, and caring concern for all in our midst.

Senior Pastor, Craig Goodrich sets the welcoming tone for each service with "We are in the Heart of Naples with the Love of God."

2019 is the reflection of continued growth and harmony exhibited by our warm and enthusiastic membership that have volunteered for multiple missions and outreach projects. First Presbyterian Church welcomed 40 new members during the year. Because our attendance is seasonal, our Church Services are scheduled to meet the demand. This means two services each Sunday during January through April and only one service each Sunday the rest of the year.

Rex Childs, as Associate Pastor continues to focus on mission, pastoral care, and educational programs for youth and adults. Rex has proven to be a valued colleague to Pastor Craig whether contributing to our Sunday worship services or meeting the needs of this vibrant congregation.

Guest preachers were Rev. Graham Hart, Dr. George and Kathy Goodrich, Rev. George Wirth, Rev. Bill Crawford, Dr. Winston Lawson and Cuban Pastors, Ary Fernandez Alban and Beidy Casas Aragon.

Director of Music Ministries, Dr. Brice Gerlach, has showcased each of our services with his amazing skill with the 6,200 pipe organ. The Ash Wednesday service kicked off the Lenten Season and Holy Week services include Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and three services for Easter. The Advent Season highlighted the birth of Christ with a "Blue Christmas" service, a Christmas Eve service with children's pageant, and our traditional "Candlelight Service." The Kirkin' of the Tartans in October is still one of the most popular services. Brice has been instrumental in bringing us the Season of Music Concerts. The FGCU Choir is always exceptional. Smaller groups like the Naples Chamber Brass Quintet have added to our worship services through each year.

Presbyterian Women

Barbara Heissner, Moderator

During 2019 First Presbyterian Women responded to God's love by offering our many talents and gifts to others.

- Monetary donations to 14 local agencies totaled \$6,600
- PW Thank Offering totaling \$768.00 and Birthday Offering was \$864.25
- Donations were collected at the Gatherings which supported Collier Harvest Food Pantry in the amount of \$466.45.
- Blanket Sunday produced warm bedding and \$125.00 for St. Matthews House.
- "Prayershawls" knitted 147 shawls since their inception in 2015 which have gone to people in need of prayers, as well as a large strip blanket for Africa.
- Sew & Sews made numerous dresses, dolls, hats, blankets and tote bags for overseas shipment and 57 pink headbands for the Race for Breast Cancer.
- The PW was also responsible for baking and serving cookies and punch after services.
- Four Circles meet monthly for the Bible Study and fellowship.

All are welcome to participate in any or all activities of the Presbyterian Women.

Communications

Kathleen Law, Communications Coordinator

Our online presence continues to grow as we reach people in several countries around the world through our online worship services and Facebook. Currently, we advertise in two Naples magazines (Old Naples News and Naples Illustrated), the Artis-Naples playbill, the Naples Chamber of Commerce (2 publications), Facebook, and the Naples Daily News. We advertise 3 times a week in the newspaper, as well as larger ads for special events, Christmas and Easter. We have over 500 followers on Facebook which has proven to be very successful in engaging our members, friends, and the public community. E-mail communication continues to be very successful and weekly e-mails are being sent to nearly 800 members and friends.

Adult Education

The activity and responsibility of this committee is quite diverse. Some programs of adult education report to us but are not directly ours. Essentially, these are WOW and Wednesday Morning Men, Faith and Fellowship.

A major offering of this committee is the Wednesday evening presentations with dinner. From January 23 to February 13 a series of talks on the "Abrahamic religions" was held. After an introductory presentation by Rev. Rex Childs we heard from leaders of different religious perspectives. These were: Judaism, Islam and Orthodoxy (Greek). This series was well received and stimulating. In Lent our pastors put together a series relating to end of life issues. In the fall we focused on learning about our mission partners. We heard from Rev. Ary Fernandez Alban and Rev. Beidy Casas Aragon from our sister church in Matanzas Cuba, from Dorie Hjalmarson, Presbyterian mission worker in Honduras and Larry Comstock concerning the work of World Vision, especially the WASH program in Honduras, with the theme of "finishing well".

After much discussion we decided to offer an opportunity for learning on Sunday mornings called Sunday Seminars. Classes were offered in May, June, September and October. Biblical content has been primary. Sunday Seminars have been offered at 8:30 a.m. when we have just the one worship service at 9:30 a.m. We are in ongoing discussion as to how we can offer these classes all year.

A discussion of the Infancy Narratives in Matthew and Luke was led by Bill Crawford from 11/19 to 12/10 on Tuesday afternoons.

As the year came to a close we were at work on a series on the environment to be presented in January 2020.

Throughout 2019 a great deal of effort has gone into creating a church library in the parlor. Shelves were purchased and installed and books were donated and purchased. The books have been cataloged in a computer program, and an opening date of February 2020 was anticipated.

The Wednesday Morning Men, Faith and Fellowship has continued to have interesting presentations and discussions. There is an atmosphere of sharing thoughts and insights as well as a growth in fellowship. Bill Kearney continues to lead this program.

Andie Goodrich and Bill Crawford, co-chairs

Children and Youth

We began 2019 with a new Director of Children and Youth, Nancy Van Fleet. We are grateful for the energy, spiritual depth and life that she has brought to the program.

Sunday School has continued to be a multi-grade program with the older students helping the younger ones. During the summer, it was a different tempo with Sunday Funday and then in the fall, it was renamed to be Kidz Lab, to be more reflective of the innovative programming that is taking place. Nursery continued to be available for infants through preschoolers. Two of the older youth are now assistants in Nursery (Audrey Gordon) and Kidz Lab (Jack Fogelman).

A children and youth choir has begun with rehearsals twice a month.

Youth group has grown in numbers and spiritual formation. They have had a trip to Orlando for a Christian rock music festival and 17 students went to Montreat for the annual youth conference there. They have been participants in planning for the series on the environment, and have been on a group boat trip at Conservancy with Captain Doug Jensen. Efforts are being made to incorporate the youth more into the life of the church, with them serving as youth liturgist, ushers and greeters. They offered a hot chocolate bar in Spencer Hall after worship in December, and held a dinner for those who participated in the Sunday Seminar that Nancy Van Fleet presented on the book Growing Young.

Parents Night Out (formerly called First Friday) continues on a monthly basis, providing an opportunity for parents to have a safe and fun place for their children to be while they have time off from parenting responsibilities. This is valued by parents of children in our church and our Preschool. This is staffed by our staff, volunteer adults and youth.

VBS in June was a successful program for children preschool through grade five. Many adult and youth volunteers made it possible.

A new child protection policy was passed by Session, providing the framework for our efforts to keep children safe while they are in our care.

The Facilities Committee oversees the grounds, building, and equipment. Maintenance, cleaning, refurbishing, are essential to an attractive, functional, and inviting house of worship.

Additions to everyday maintenance in 2019:

- Sanctuary air conditioning was evaluated by an independent specialist to establish long term objectives, guide future maintenance; repair or modification. Deficiencies were corrected and improvements made.
- Courtyard landscaping design installed, trellis replaced, benches refinished
- All building exterior painted, woodpecker proofed, new sconces.
- Five year capital plan completed.
- Insurance and fire inspections were generally favorable, adjustments made.
- Reupholstery of pew seats and choir chairs planned to be accomplished off season in 2020, limited sections at a time.
- Elevator cost and service quality were reviewed, modifications planned.
- Preschool windows were tinted for privacy and safety.
- Digital telephone system installed.
- A portable handwashing station was provided for nursery use.
- Parlor library design was reviewed and supported.
- Second floor Christian Education Building interior repainted.
- New carpeting installed in first and second floor offices and choir hallway.

Preschool

Ashley Houk, Preschool Director

Highlights from 2019

- The Preschool implemented the use of a new web-based student database program. Sandbox Software provides accurate record of student and staff files, allows families to sign their student in and out electronically and provides parents secure access to their child/ren's file through a Parent Portal account.
- We hosted an annual Silent Auction, which raised \$6,000 to help fund our curriculum enrichment programs.
- Upon the resignation of the Administrative Assistant, the Preschool hired an Assistant Director, Lindsay Willkomm.
- A three-week summer camp for students, ages 2 through 6 was offered. Included in the summer camp enrollment were some of the new, incoming students for 2019-2020.
- \$360 was raised during our California Pizza Kitchen fundraiser.
- Scholarship funding was provided for two children for a full school year.
- Ashley Houk attended the Florida Association for the Education of Young Children conference in Orlando.

The Preschool was awarded a Kindergarten Readiness Rate of 100 (highest possible score) for 2018-2019. Providers are awarded a readiness rate that reflects how prepared their VPK students were when they entered Kindergarten.
