### SPECIAL EVENTS MINISTRY

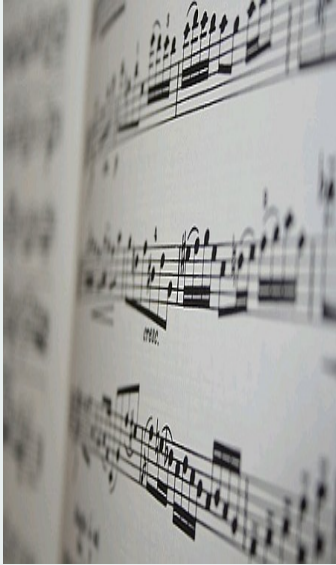
Assist with weddings and other special events.
