**The Lenten Journey** — As I write, I have returned to my office from our noon Ash Wednesday service. That service invites us along the Lenten path. I was so moved by the hymn, “I Take the Cross of Jesus Christ.”

*I take the cross of Jesus Christ in ashes on my face.  
This ancient symbol made in dust reminds me of His grace.  
I beg for mercy from my Lord, to cleanse me deep within.  
I know myself, my faulty life, my tendency toward sin.*

*O cross of ashes, speak again in ways I understand;  
Speak forth repentance, let me know forgiveness from Your hand.  
Have mercy on us, Lord, we pray; Look deep within and find  
our hearts made whole, our thoughts made pure, our eyes no longer blind.*

*This cross of ashes on my brow reminds me life is brief.  
From dust I came, to dust I go through sorrow, pain, and grief.  
These forty days are set aside for those who share the call  
to take the cross, deny themselves, and give to Christ their all.*

These words could be prayed daily, not only through the Lenten season but throughout the year. The line, “I know myself, my faulty life, my tendency toward sin,” is so honest about our human predicament. I have noted over the last several years an increasing self-righteous smugness in our public debates. People are pointing their finger at others. The prophet Isaiah told the Israelites if they wanted God’s guidance they needed “*to remove the yoke from among you, the pointing of the finger, the speaking of evil. . .*” (Isaiah 58: 9b). The problem with being consumed with the sins of others is that such judgment not only swells us with self-righteousness, the worst of sins, but more alarming it blinds us from our own need of repentance. Paschal, the Christian philosopher, once observed about the doctrine of sin: “Nothing jolts us more rudely than this doctrine, and yet but for the mystery, the most incomprehensible of all, we remain incomprehensible to ourselves.” The Lenten season calls us to take our focus off others and do the more difficult work of self-examination. Jesus has walked the path to the cross. The Lenten season calls us in repentance to walk toward the cross of Christ. Our Lenten worship is designed to guide us along that sacred path. I hope you will join us each week in this forty-day journey to the cross of Christ.

**Broken Signposts** — I will conclude our study of *Broken Signposts: How Christianity Makes Sense of Our World* on March 3. We will conclude with a discussion of the concept of power. Our culture highly prizes power. We see that in our political culture, corporate culture, and, yes, even our religious culture. Jesus looked at power through a different lens. As Christians, we need to think through our understanding of power and make sure it lines up with Jesus’ teachings. I hope you will join us for this final, stimulating discussion.

**Contemplative Worship** — On Wednesday, March 10, we will return to our in-person Contemplative Worship services at 6:30 p.m. You will remember this is a thirty-minute service with contemplative music, scripture, confession, the Lord’s Supper, and guided prayer. I have found this worship time to be so refreshing. I hope you will join us each Wednesday evening. ## Narrative Report On Financial Position / FBCSP

### Fourth Quarter 2020 vs. Fourth Quarter 2019

Our giving goal through the twelve months of the year was \$1,329,395 and we received \$1,299,353. Through the end of December, pledged offerings received exceeded the amount committed for 2020 by almost 2%. By contrast, pledged offerings through December of last year were 92.83% of the amount committed for 2019 while the giving goal was \$1,330,289 and \$1,343,391 was received.

The church’s operating cash flow increased \$75,335 in the fourth quarter of 2020 with receipts exceeding expenses \$137,387 for the year. Our giving goal through December was \$30,042 less than projected. By comparison, cash flow in the fourth quarter of 2019 increased \$24,999 with receipts exceeding expenses by \$68,900 for the year. Our giving goal through December 2019 was \$13,102 more than projections.

The balance in the Capital Improvement Fund on December 31, 2020, was \$743 after receiving contributions of \$700 during the quarter.

**Ministry of Missions Update:** During the fourth quarter of 2020, your dollars supported Habitat for Humanity/NC Sandhills, Bethesda Half-Way House, Bethany House, Boys & Girls Club of The Sandhills, Family Promise of Moore County, Coalition for Human Care, as well as Moore Buddies Mentoring, Vass Lions Club Charitable Trust, Monte de Horeb Ministries, Team Workz, and the Meals on Wheels of the Sandhills. We received \$13,778.90 of our Christmas Offering goal of \$18,000. Contributions received for Lottie Moon were \$7,995.90 and \$5,783.00 for CBF/Global Missions.

Our General Endowment Fund balance on December 31, 2020, was \$425,250. The balance in the Jeannie H. Jordan Memorial Endowment was \$77,317. 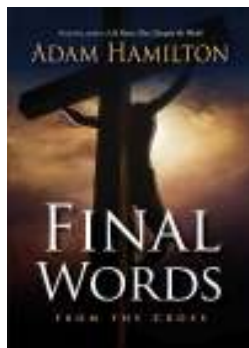

## **Lenten Podcast Series: “The Seven Last Words of Christ”**

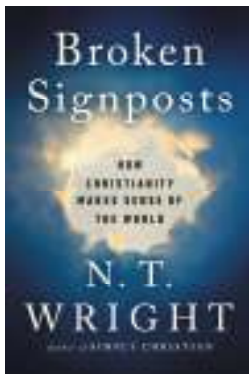

## **Goodbye to a Friend**

From 2000-2012, First Baptist and our Missions Committee partnered with the American Belarussian Relief Organization (ABRO), a faith-based group that brings children who live in regions affected by the 1986 Chernobyl nuclear accident to the United States for six weeks of respite and health care. Several First Baptist families hosted children during those years.

I recently learned that the group’s beloved chaperone and interpreter, Dr. Elena Kotlerova, died unto Christ on February 7, in Belarus, of complications related to COVID-19. Along with her love for the children she chaperoned, as well as the families that hosted her and them, Dr. Lena, a dentist, loved First Baptist and the American friends she made over the years. Beverly and I recall not only her love of First Baptist but also how she enjoyed meals at the Golden Corral and the group’s annual trip to Emerald Pointe waterpark. One summer, Dr. Lena made a profession of faith, and I had the privilege of baptizing her. Please pray for her husband, Vova, and sons, Sergei and Slava and their families.



Also, know that the love and support of First Baptist had a profound effect on the lives of the children we hosted as well as their families. Most went on to university or their equivalent of community college, married, and have families of their own. Those of us who hosted children keep up with them through social media and cherish great memories, along with the ministry we provided to these children and their families.

## What IS a Prayer of Blessing?

Numbers 6:22-27 isn’t the only prayer of blessing you could pray over your kids, but it does give some fabulous insight into the practice of praying blessings over others:

*The Lord said to Moses,  
“Tell Aaron and his sons, ‘This is how you are to bless the Israelites. Say to them:  
“‘The Lord bless you and keep you;  
the Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you;  
the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace.’”  
“So they will put my name on the Israelites, and I will bless them.”*  
— Numbers 6:22-27 NIV

God literally COMMANDED the Israelite priests to speak these words over the community. Why? It’s certainly not a magic spell or incantation that guarantees a good life, and it’s not a pipeline to health and prosperity. *God’s blessings are gracious and generous and have immense power to change the lives of our children forever.* We aren’t limited to praying Number 6:22-27 over our children. Here are some of my personal favorite prayers of blessing for my kids:

Have I not commanded you?  
Be strong and courageous.

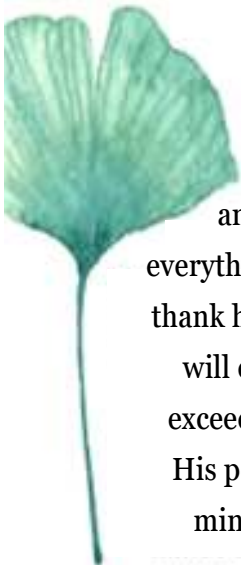
Do not be afraid;

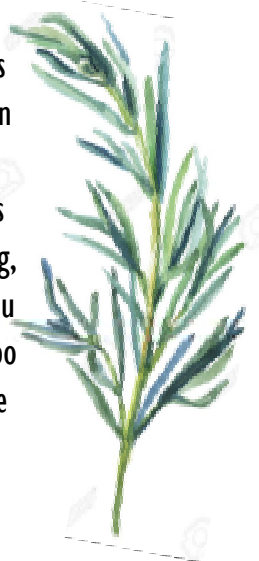
## Philippians 4:6-7 (NLT)

Don’t worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank him for all he has done. Then you will experience God’s peace, which exceeds anything we can understand. His peace will guard your hearts and minds as you live in Christ Jesus.



May Christ make his home in your heart as you trust in him. Your roots will grow down into God’s love and keep you strong. And may you have the power to understand, as all God’s people should, how wide, how long, how high, and how deep his love is. May you experience the love of Christ, though it is too great to understand fully. Then you will be made complete with all the fullness of life and power that comes from God.

For people of faith, Holy Week is one of the richest times of the church year. Soon, our long nights of winter will make way for light, and we will prepare for the holiest days in the Christian calendar. During Holy Week, believers will walk the final journey to the cross; we will participate in and remember that climactic last week of Jesus' life on earth. We will celebrate and worship on Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, and Resurrection Sunday.

### ***Palm Sunday — March 28***

Palm Sunday begins as a day of jubilation as Jesus makes his way into the city of Jerusalem for the last time. Soon afterward, the cheers fade and the events that lead to the cross become more vivid. Here we take part in the journey toward the passion of our Lord.

### ***Maundy Thursday — April 1***

Maundy Thursday (or Holy Thursday) takes its name from John 13:34, "a new commandment I give to you." The Latin word for *commandment* is *mandatum*; we derive the word Maundy from this word. This day commemorates the washing of feet and Last Supper of Jesus Christ with his disciples. Our service will be in the form of a Tenebrae—we will extinguish candles and diminish the lights as we remember and share the scriptures and events just prior the crucifixion of Jesus.

Our service this year will feature a string quartet, hymns, and choral music and be held at 7:00 p.m. The sign-up link for the Maundy Thursday service is <https://fbcpnc.flocknote.com/signup/43028>.

### ***Resurrection Sunday — April 4***

On the third day after his crucifixion, we celebrate Resurrection Sunday, the day Jesus Christ was raised from the dead. Resurrection Sunday is the fulfilled prophecy of the Messiah who would be persecuted, die for our sins, and rise on the third day. Remembering the resurrection of Jesus is a way to renew daily hope that we have victory over sin. Celebrate with us on Sunday, April 4. He is Risen! He is Risen, indeed!

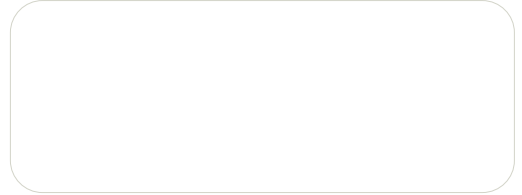
