Dear Awana Family,

We're already making plans for this coming summer ... Summit Leadership Camp at Pine Summit Christian Camps is going to be even better ...

THE BASICS

What is Summit Leadership Camp all about, you ask? It is a week (Sunday to Saturday) set aside by Pine Summit Christian Camps, our host, for Awana students. It is intense spiritual growth, exciting fun, great food, fabulous friends, dedicated counselors, and adventures.

This is your time to be s-t-r-e-t-c-h-e-d in every way ... God will be molding you into His spiritual soldier. You will be memorizing verses from God's Word daily, involved in daily Bible lessons, taking part in evening devotions with your cabin mates, learning how to develop a personal quiet time each day with the Lord, and competing with your team in some crazy activities!

Summit Leadership Camp is for Awana clubbers who are entering sixth grade or higher in the fall and have completed this year's materials. Clubbers in T&T must have earned the Excellence Award. Trek and Journey students must have completed one year of Trek or Journey material and be able to do an Oasis in Trek or a Review in Journey in one sitting with no more than two (2) helps. All work must be completed prior to the end of your club year.

Awana students will be divided into two (2) distinct camps with separate programs, teachers, and speakers ... JUNIOR HIGH CAMP is campers going into grades 6, 7, and 8. SENIOR HIGH CAMP is campers going into grades 9, 10, 11,12, and those having graduated that we call "Super Seniors".

THE EXPECTATIONS

All students accepted to attend camp are expected to participate in camp for the ENTIRE week. Each camper will be expected to:

- 1) complete the daily lessons
- 2) recite the daily verses (word perfect)
- 3) review the weeks' memory verses: five (5) to ten (10) Bible verses with no more than two (2) helps to be able to return to camp next year

THE COST

The cost of camp this year will be **\$315.00** per student. Get your application and registration fee in by **March 1, 2010**.

- Your application must be accompanied by a **\$150.00 non-refundable** registration fee to be accepted.
- Checks should be made out to the church that sponsors your club, NOT Pine Summit.
- Give your application and payment(s) to the Camp Coordinator at your Awana club.

The balance of your camper fees (\$165.00) must be in to your camp coordinator by May 5, 2010. Not doing so could cost you your spot at camp because we will open your spot to a student on the waiting list.

THE REQUIREMENTS

February and March are the best months to turn in the required items to register for camp, which will fill up very quickly ... often by the March deadline. Your Awana church will assist you by mailing in all of the necessary items from your club together in one package. You will want to do your part to help them meet the deadlines to reserve your spot at Camp.

The following items make up a complete application:

- Registration Form - completed and legibly signed and dated by each required person
- Medical & Liability Release Form - completed and signed
- Photocopy of insurance card - front & back onto 8.5"x 11" paper (contact Pine Summit if not insured)
- Non-refundable application fee of \$150.00 made payable to your Awana church

Note: Incomplete applications will be returned to your club and jeopardize your spot at camp.

THE GOODS

The camp fees cover a week (Sunday to Saturday) of camp including all activities. Most campers bring extra money for crafts, bookstore, snacks, and missions offering. We have included a sheet listing the approximate cost of most of these items.

All camp fees should be paid through your Awana church. The church will send Pine Summit one check for the Application Fee (due in March) and another check for the remaining balance (due in May). Please note the following registration and fee deadlines:

If a reservation is cancelled, the applicant forfeits the registration fee. If a reservation is cancelled after June 15th or if a camper does not stay for the entire camp, no refund can be given. A camper that is not accepted will be refunded their application fee.

Please understand that Summit Leadership Camp is not equipped to handle special physical, emotional, or educational needs. All such circumstances need to be discussed with your Camp Coordinator prior to applying.

THE GET

You can expect to complete daily lessons, daily verse memorization, chapel services, daily quiet times, evening devotions, 4-way team competition, free time activities, lots of good food, and time to make friends with other Awana students. All students that are accepted to attend camp are expected to participate in camp for the entire week.

THE GIVE

Pray that the Lord will do great things in the lives of all who attend. Our hope is that God teaches, humbles, stretches, squeezes, challenges, convicts, and rewards.

Consent to Attend Camp

I hereby give permission for Camper to attend and participate in the Camp.

Release of Liability

Prior to Camper's participation in Camp activities, I acknowledge that involvement of Camper in the Camp may involve risk of property damage and of personal injury, illness or even death of Camper, including but not limited to the risks arising from transportation-related activities, recreational activities, accidents in the outdoors and rustic facilities, adverse weather conditions, and injuries and illness as a result of food-borne illnesses and allergic reactions. In addition, I understand that there may be other risks inherent in Camp activities of which I may not be presently aware.

By signing this Consent and Release of Liability, I warrant that Camper is fully capable of safely participating in all Camp activities, and I expressly assume all risks of Camper's participation, whether such risks are known or unknown to me at this time. I further generally release Pine Summit, and their directors, officers, employees, volunteers, and agents, and other campers at the Camp, from any and all claims against any of them as a result of property damage or personal injury, illness or death of Camper as a result of participation in Camp activities, whether on or off Camp grounds. I agree that this release includes the ordinary, special and inherent risks described above, and other risks that I may not foresee or be aware of at this time. This Release of Liability is given on behalf of myself, my minor child (if Camper), and the heirs, family, estate, administrators, executors, personal representatives and assignees.

Consent to Medical Treatment

If Camper experiences an injury or illness, or has other medical needs, I authorize the Camp's employees, volunteers, and agents to make such arrangements for Camper's health and safety, including but not limited to first aid, emergency medical care, ambulance or other transportation to a hospital, medical office, or clinic, testing and examination, and hospital care, and other medical care and treatment (including dental care) as they feel are appropriate in the circumstances. I further agree that I am fully responsible to pay all charges and expenses relating to such care, transportation and treatment and I hereby fully release Pine Summit and its directors, officers, employees, volunteers and agents from any claims, including claims for medical charges, prescription costs and other expense, I might have as a result of such care, transportation and treatment. My signature below also serves to indicate my willingness for my Health Insurance Company (please provide details in the Medical Information section) to be billed for any and all medical fees and services should they be needed. I agree that I will pay all charges and expenses not covered by insurance.

Other Releases and Acknowledgements

I understand that, while Camper is participating in Camp activities, photographs, film, audio recordings and videotape of Camper may be taken for use in brochures, videos, releases to the press, and various Pine Summit publications and other work product. KEEPING YOUR FOCUS - POLICIES ON DRESS AND BEHAVIOR

Colossians 1:18: That in all things He might have the preeminence . . .

In order to maintain an environment that is free from distractions, so that we all may focus on what the Lord has in store for us this week; the following policies need to be followed by campers and counselors alike:

Everyone is expected to **conduct** themselves in a manner which reflects an atmosphere of “**focusing on the spiritual.**” **Modesty** and **appropriateness** will be the **standard of dress and behavior.**

This includes the following:

- No visible undergarments. They are called “undergarments” for a reason.
- All shorts should reach to the mid-thigh with a six inch inseam. If the fingertips can touch the skin on the thighs the shorts are too short. No “spandex” type shorts please.
- Skirts and dresses should be knee length or longer.
- All forms of clothing should cover the wearer’s midriff, and for females, the cleavage.
- All shirts must have sleeves. No tank tops.
- No offensive clothing which exhibits alcohol, drug, tobacco products, satanic symbols, inappropriate language, or other offensive displays.
- While swimming or canoeing:
 - Females: one-piece suit, covering cleavage, bust, and midriff areas.
 - No Thong, g-string, and high French-cut style swimwear.
 - No two-piece suits (even if worn under a T-shirt).
 - Males: “boxer” style suits with at least five (5) inch inseam and nylon or mesh liner.
- No display of body piercing (other than earrings for females) please.
- Footwear is required at all times except inside the bath houses, cabins, and while swimming. Athletic shoes are required for Team Activity Time.
- Romantic activities are out of place at camp. Do not spend your days exclusively with one particular member of the opposite gender.
- Once the chapel service has started, do not leave your seat to visit the restroom. These things should be taken care of before hand.
- Use quiet voices while outside after dark.
- Phone calls are not allowed.

Anyone who notices distractions such as those listed above should **report it only to the appropriate Head Counselor.** They will handle it according to their interpretation of the above policy which will allow us to have consistency. We do not want all our counselors or staff to be distracted by acting as policemen.

DIRECTIONS TO PINE SUMMIT

FROM NORTH - VICTORVILLE

- 1: Exit I-15 at SR-18 and follow the signs through Lucerne Valley and up the mountain to Big Bear Lake.
- 2: At the top of the mountain proceed straight onto W NORTH SHORE DR for 2.3 miles.
- 3: Turn LEFT on Stanfield Cutoff (road name).
- 4: Turn RIGHT onto BIG BEAR BLVD for 1.6 miles.
- 5: Pass CARL'S JUNIOR and look LEFT.
- 6: Turn LEFT onto WREN DR.
- 7: WREN DR. Ends at PINE SUMMIT.

FROM SOUTH - SAN BERNARDINO

- 1: From I-210 or I-215 or I-30.
- 2: Merge onto CA-330 N toward MTN RESORTS and proceed up the mountain.
- 3: CA-330 N becomes CA-18 / RIM OF THE WORLD HWY.
- 4: Turn RIGHT onto CA-18 / BIG BEAR BLVD over the dam for 4.0 miles.
- 5: Turn LEFT onto PAINE RD / CA-18/ BIG BEAR BLVD and proceed for 1.2 miles.
- 6: Pass MCDONALD'S (on the left) and look right.
- 7: Turn RIGHT onto WREN DR.
- 8: WREN DR. Ends at PINE SUMMIT.

ALTERNATE ROUTE

- 1: From I-10 exit on Orange Street and proceed North.
- 2: Turn RIGHT on Lugonia/SR-38.
- 3: Follow SR-38 up the mountain/BIG BEAR CITY.
- 4: SR-38 becomes SR-18/BIG BEAR BLVD.
- 5: Proceed on SR-18/BIG BEAR BLVD West into BIG BEAR LAKE.
- 6: Pass CARL'S JUNIOR and look LEFT.
- 7: Turn LEFT onto WREN DR.
- 8: WREN DR. Ends at PINE SUMMIT.
