## February Adult Education

**Effective Listening (Lounge):** Bradley Hills identifies the members of the congregation as its ministers. As we assume this critical role in our faith community, it is important that we be able to listen to each other effectively. The first session on January 25, was devoted to exploring what is involved in listening effectively and the second session on **February 1**, will focus on applications of what we know about this communication skill to listening, individually and collectively, in the Bradley Hills community. Andrew Wolvin, University of Maryland communication professor whose research centers on listening behavior.

**Conversations with David Gray (Lounge)** Come meet with our new pastor and share your stories about our church. Pastor Gray will be holding informal discussions on Sundays **February 8 and 15** from 9:15-10:00. Come one of those Sundays with stories of why you joined and belong to BHPC, and share stories of our church's past. This is an opportunity to connect with David and begin to get to know each other better.

**Wayfarers: Explorations in Faith (Library) -- February 1, 8, 22.**

This book discussion group will continue its study of Marcus Borg's transformative work, *Jesus: Uncovering the Life, Teachings and Relevance of a Religious Revolutionary*. Discussion leadership is rotated among the participants, and new members are always welcome. The class will not meet February 15 in order to give members an opportunity to participate in Pastor David Gray's conversations with the congregation.

**Faith and Ministries (Lounge)** Following up on Effective Listening, members of BHPC, will discuss how their involvement in the ministries at Bradley Hills strengthen and broaden their faith experience and become better ministers. The first of three sessions will be held on **February 25**. The format for this series will involve a panel with interactive audience participation.

## Intercongregational Partnership (IPPIES)

Bethesda Jewish Congregation's open book discussion meets once a month on the third or fourth Wednesday of the month at 8 pm in the library. This month's meeting will be held on February 18. We are a diverse inter-congregational group and all interested men and women are welcome. We will discuss *Out of Egypt* by Andre Aciman, An extraordinary memoir of an eccentric genuinely Levantine family and the tale of a vanished multicultural world from the Istanbul of sultans to the Alexandria of Egypt up to Nasser -- teeming with people of a dozen ethnic groups, creeds, rules and habits- and of the life of a young man doomed to say goodbye to its charms. ## Parish Nurse's Notes

There are two important national health observances that occur in February. One is **Friday, February 6<sup>th</sup>, National Wear Red Day** – a day when Americans nationwide will take women's health to heart by wearing red to show their support for women's heart disease awareness. Heart disease remains the #1 Killer of Women.

The second national observance occurs for the whole month of February and highlights **AMD/Low Vision Awareness Month**. AMD stands for Age-Related Macular Degeneration and several members of our faith community have this condition. The retina is a thin layer of tissue that lines the back of the eye and is likened to film in a camera. It is the "seeing" part of the eye that takes a picture and sends it to the brain through the optic nerve. This disease affects part of the back of the eye called the macula, the central part of the retina, which is the part of the eye that helps us to see fine detail. If the disease progresses, central vision can be lost meaning that the individual must develop the ability to look slightly off center using peripheral vision. Macular degeneration almost never causes total blindness but it can require the use of various vision devices and strategies. There are two forms of macular degeneration – wet and dry.

Yearly eye exams are the best defense against macular degeneration as the eye doctor may detect changes in the eye that mean that this condition is developing. If that is the case, the doctor will

usually give the patient a simple way of testing their own vision daily to monitor changes in vision. As the disease progresses, vision may become blurred for distance or close up and a frequent and important symptom is distortion of vision where straight lines may look bent, crooked, or wavy. Type may look blurry when ready or you may notice a dark or empty spot blocking the center of your vision.

The treatment of AMD has changed very rapidly over the past few years, and new potential treatments continue to be developed and tested. Treatments for wet and dry forms of the disease differ but they may consist of vitamin supplements, drugs injected into the eye, or laser treatments. Only your eye doctor will know what would be the optimum treatment for you. The earlier that wet macular degeneration is discovered, the more likely it is that vision-sparing treatment can be done. **The important thing to note is that you need to pay close attention to your eyesight and see your eye doctor promptly if there is any type of change in your vision. You may need to insist on an appointment but time may be of the essence in saving your eyesight.** If you would like further information on this common eye disease, please contact me.

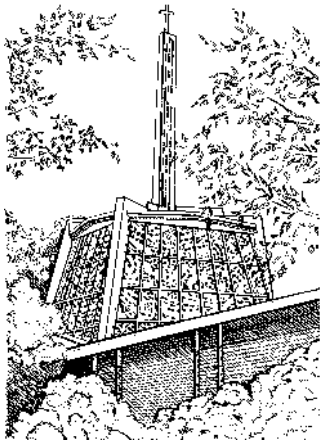
