Chapter 9 - The Holy Spirit Helps Us to Live

Raleigh Diocese Objectives:

- God is Father, Son and Holy Spirit - Trinity.
- The Holy Spirit is our helper.
- The Feast of Pentecost celebrates the coming of the Holy Spirit and the birthday of the Church.
- No two people are exactly alike.
- God gave each of us special gifts and talents.
- God wants us to share our gifts and talents with others.
- Baptism calls us to serve God and others.
- A vocation is an invitation to serve others in a particular way.
