

## C.I.T. Training Program

**(June 11 - 12, 2008) – Fee \$360**

**Fee covers training program and a week of camp.** The Counselors In Training Program is open to 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> graders. Admission to this program is by application and pre-camp recommendation only. The fee covers a 3-day training session; thereafter C.I.T.s may choose to serve during either the Youth or Elementary Camp.

## Elementary Camp

**(June 15 – 20, 2008) - Fee \$360**

Elementary Camp is open to rising 3<sup>rd</sup> – rising 6<sup>th</sup> graders.

## Youth Camp

**(June 22 – 27, 2008) - Fee \$360**

Youth Camp is open to rising 7<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> graders.

## Registration Process

Diocesan Summer Camp 2007 welcomes all campers regardless of race, sex or denomination. All applications will be dated upon receipt and considered on a first-come, first-served basis.

A \$100 nonrefundable deposit must accompany each 2007 application. The deposit will be applied to the total fee. The fee balance for all sessions is June 1, 2008 (\$50 late fee after June 1). A limited amount of financial assistance is available; the appropriate forms must be completed.

Additional registration materials will be mailed upon receipt of deposit and registration forms. The medical update form is required of each camper and is due upon arrival. - All campers are expected to attend each session in its entirety.
- Campers may attend only one session per summer unless space permits.
- Campers, C.I.T.s, and Camp Staff will abide by the Camp Covenant which must be signed by each camper, and counter signed by parent/guardian, and rector.
- Campers, C.I.T.s, and Camp Staff who violate non-negotiable rules will be sent home.
- Parents/guardians are responsible for transportation home.

## Arrival & Departure

**Arrival** — Registration takes place on Sunday afternoon - from 4:00–5 p.m. Early arrivals **cannot** be accommodated, as our staff will be busy preparing for camp.

**Departure** — Campers must be picked up between **1:00 pm** and **1:30 pm on the closing day of camp**. Lunch will be served to campers and staff prior to their departure. C.I.T.s must be picked up by **3:00 p.m.** the same day.

The **Episcopal Summer Camp** is a program sponsored by the Episcopal dioceses of Southwest and Southeast Florida, serving a combined total of 162 congregations. We are proud to offer quality programming in which health and safety issues are a top priority. The two weeklong sessions for two different age groups are designed to give campers an enjoyable and meaningful and developmentally appropriate camping experience.

Campers participate in a Christian program designed to help them grow spiritually and emotionally, providing them opportunities to explore new interests, skills and friendships. Activities include swimming, hiking, canoeing, low-ropes challenge course (Elementary Camp) and high-rope course (Youth Camp) exercises, tennis, field sports, basketball and court games, and craft activities. Music and the arts are also an important part of the program. Participants are encouraged to bring their own instruments and share their talents. Campers are given "free time" daily providing an opportunity to process the day's events, and spend time with their old and new friends in Christ.

- ❖ to build, nurture and live in an intentionally Christ-centered community, helping each camper gain a deeper understanding of, and appreciation for their own skills, abilities and gifts as a child of God;

## Episcopal Conference Center

Camps are held at DaySpring, which is ideally situated between the Tampa/St. Petersburg and Sarasota/Bradenton metropolitan areas. This 92-acre tropical garden sanctuary is situated along the picturesque banks of the Manatee River. Campers are accommodated in air-conditioned cabins and served healthy, professionally prepared, buffet-style meals and snacks.

Youth friendly, the facilities offers a great mix of indoor and outdoor activities, which include two swimming pools, canoes for happy paddling on the Manatee River, volleyball, basketball, and tennis courts, bike and jogging paths and a large playing field for flag football, soccer or just running around.
