### King's Kids

- King's Kids Nursery for children ages 0-4 opens at 9:15. It is staffed with loving, consistent caregivers as well as members of the body. All kids are to be picked up by 12:15.
- Children are engaged in an age-appropriate learning experience with an excellent ratio of adults to children. Older nursery kids may join the K and 1st graders in their worship, during the sermon, returning to the nursery, or to the service for communion with their parents.
- King's Kids (K – 5th) participate in the worship service until dismissed for creative Bible-based and age-appropriate learning experiences intended to help them encounter God and prepare for Holy Communion. Kids return to the service at “the Peace.”
