Our last Executive Board meeting was Monday, November 17, but in the continued attempt to use some creativity in scheduling and content so that additional persons beyond the regular attendees might be included in the meeting, the Board met at Ooltewah Baptist Church following the January Bible Study Preview of the book of Exodus. This study was led by Dr. Walter Crouch of Carson Newman College. It was an excellent study. All present wished that it had extended through most of the day, rather than just the morning hours. The Executive Board's Book of Reports was provided for each person present. Although there was a brief time for questions regarding the reports, members were urged to call me with any questions or comments following their more thorough reading of the reports.

Today's meeting is another attempt to provide a more convenient time for the Executive Board meeting. While a good, free breakfast might have served as some encouragement to attend, the hope by the associational leadership is that more people will take greater interest in all aspects of our mission work together, including the Board meeting five times a year: September, November, January, March and May.

I met with church planter Jason Hart, sponsoring church pastor Ray Williams and state church start leader Fred Davis. We discussed the plans Jason has for establishing the Southside Bible Fellowship, a new Baptist mission. He is currently meeting in the BCM building on the UTC campus. We are glad to see Jason's work progressing. We continue to pray for these new missions: Southside Bible Fellowship led by Jason, Journey led by Mark Love and Solid Anchor led by Johnny Horne. I pray other missions will be planted this year.

We welcome Robert (Robby) Gallaty as Pastor of Brainerd Baptist Church. We welcome Steven Wright to our association as the new pastor of Signal Mountain Baptist Church (November 9) and Darreyl Duggar to Pleasant Grove (January 4).

As you are aware, with the conclusion of R. C. Thornbury's tenure as director of HaCoBAC-are ministry center, Gerald Lawson was named leader. While this is a volunteer position, it requires a significant amount of time each week offering supervision to volunteers, making contact in the community, compiling reports, etc. Gerald has been well received and is doing an excellent job, now in his fourth month as director. I join with him in thanking our churches and many individuals for their splendid response to the call for turkeys and hams during the holiday season and for new toys for children provided to parents. Rhonda, Gerald's wife, provides direction to this Christmas toy effort along with many other responsibilities related to clothing at the center, in particular. I am grateful for their dedication to the work of ministering to others in Jesus' Name on all of our behalf. They are joined by a dedicated corps of volunteers each Tuesday through Friday, 9 am - 1:00 pm each week. Pray for this ministry as families are being fed and many individuals are responding to the witness of volunteers to become Christians.

The Senior Adult Holiday Meal was well attended on December 11. Delicious food was enjoyed as well as a program of music led by Steve Cathell. This is one of the major senior adult events sponsored by the association each year. The Senior Adult Council will meet January 22 at the Baptist Building to share program/trip/eatery ideas among the church groups as well as plan for future associational events.

Baptist Collegiate Ministries

As difficult as the beginning of the Fall Semester was for our ministry at UTC, I was very encouraged by the progress that we made as the semester progressed. We are in a time where we have to rebuild our student leadership. While this is usually an ongoing process, we were especially hit hard this year. May, 2008 was the graduation of student leaders that we have had in service for four years. While we have some experienced leadership this year, there are many more that are both immature in their spiritual development and leadership skills.

However, as the semester progressed we saw several notable successes in addition to normal weekly programming. Our Fall/Winter retreat was held in partnership with White Oak Baptist Church. This was a very successful event with 31 participants. More importantly, it provided many of our students with an opportunity to develop their relationship with one of our local Baptist churches. Also, our lunch program has developed a regular, steady attendance of 80-100 students, staff and faculty each week. In context, this is the best consistent attendance this program has drawn in over 10 years. In addition, despite my sudden illness and inability to participate, our student leaders and interns were able to finish preparation and implementation of our December mission trip to Doraville, GA. I'm very proud of the way that they rallied and disciplined themselves to meet this challenge.

On the immediate horizon, we are in the process of launching a brand new "Family Group" ministry this semester. In addition to our 12 members of student leadership, we have recruited 10 more students to serve as Family Group Leaders (5 groups). Each group will have a guy and a girl co-leader. Each group will agree to eat a meal together once a week, do a Bible Study on the parables twice a month, do one fellowship activity each month and do one service project together each month. We have strategically chosen these leaders in a focused effort to reach out to portions of our campus where we currently are not as effective as we desire.

There are good things on the horizon for our students. I hope you will join us in prayer that we will remain faithful to God and give Him all credit and glory for what is accomplished.

HaCoBACare Ministries

The months of November and December were extremely busy at HaCoBaCare. We are seeing an increase in first time clients from 211 as well as referrals from churches.

During these two months 753 families received food which totals 1647 individuals and 622 children ages 3 to 18. We praise the Lord for 46 professions of faith and 6 rededications. During our daily morning prayer time we remember in prayer the numerous requests made by our clients.

The Baptist Nursing Fellowship during these two months checked 153 blood pressures, issued 38 pairs of glasses and 8 consultations of specific health issues. Not only is this service used by our clients but the volunteers also avail themselves of the blood pressure checks.

There were over 36 volunteers who helped with toys this year. Some had helped before but others had never been inside of HaCoBa.

Thank you to all churches and individuals who provided us with new and used toys for 309 families with 766 children.

There is a need for donations of canned goods. A sizeable purchase is being made each week for canned goods.
