Spiritual Autobiography

My name is Wanda B. Olive. I am a native Kentuckian, born in Winchester and raised in Lexington. After completing a Bachelor of Arts degree in Liberal Studies with Leadership emphasis and a minor in Philosophy in May 2004, I followed the call to Seminary. I completed one year of studies at Louisville Presbyterian Seminary then transferred to Lexington Theological Seminary in the Fall of 2005. I live in Lexington with my husband of nineteen years, Jim Olive, and our teenage daughter, Sarah. I bring a lifetime of work experience to ministry including sales and marketing, teaching, community service, and numerous church related activities. I am a member and elder of Maxwell Street Presbyterian Church. Currently I am serving as Youth Director of Chapel Hill Presbyterian Church. Before that I served as a Seminary Intern and Interim Youth Director at Versailles Presbyterian Church. I enjoy reading "heady" stuff, cooking, shopping with Sarah, Burnamwood, trips to the beach, and gardening.

My spiritual journey began when I met and married Jim Olive. I asked God what work I was to do and to put me where I was needed. I joined First Presbyterian Church in Middlesboro, Kentucky where Jim had been a member for several years. I became a volunteer with the Cooperative Christian Ministry (CCM) in Middlesboro. My prayer life, volunteer work, and connections within the League of Women Voters opened doors to unique opportunities to work with young people. Eventually I took a staff position in Pineville, Kentucky, which then led to my transfer back to Central Kentucky.

As had become my spiritual practice, I sought God's help and the power to discern God's will for my life in every decision that was placed before me. Open and continuous prayer has been the guidance in which I have learned to know, love, and serve God. Prayer has helped me to learn to act as God's agent in the world, sending and receiving love. Through prayer I have learned to worship God and learned how to use my God-given abilities to carry out God's plan for the world. I am confident that all of the open doors were a result of God's nudging.

In addition to prayer, I journal as a form of spiritual discipline. It was through this method that I discovered the path of God's leading. Although I do not write every day, I do try to record events, activities, and concerns. Over the years, I have become aware of the patterns of my life and of God's presence through journaling.

My call into ministry came long before I was willing to acknowledge it. Throughout the years, practice in various ministry capacities provided affirmation of my talents. Financial Summary

- The **Treasurer's Report through August 31, 2006** is attached.
- The Presbytery Operating Budget shows a **deficit balance of \$80,741** (*Page 3*)
- In the case of **Per Capita**, regular monthly payments are made to the General Assembly and to the Synod regardless of how much has been received from the churches. Receipts from churches for **Per Capita** (for Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly combined) for 2006 is **\$173,922**. (*Page 5*) \$102,142 has been used in the presbytery's operating budget. This is compared to \$(10,745) in 2005 as result of the shift in the per capita/unified dollars in 2006's budget. However, budgeted per capita revenue as of 8/31/06 is under budget by **\$81,409**. (*Page 2*)

Amount of Per Capita due is calculated based on the number of members reported by each local church on its Annual Statistical Report for the prior year. In other words the 2006 Per Capita is based on number of members reported as of December 31, 2004. **If no report is filed by a local church, the General Assembly carries over the number of members from the prior year.**

- Receipts from churches for **Unified Mission Giving** (for Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly combined (*Page 5*) are **\$114,701** lower for 2006 than in 2005 (\$204,000 as compared to \$318,701) as result of the shift in the per capita/unified dollars in 2006's budget.
- As a result of the shift in the per capita/unified dollars in 2006's budget, a revenue increase of **\$27,900** has resulted in the presbytery's operating budget as compared to August 2005.
- **Personnel expenditures** for 2006 are **\$18,283** more than in August 2006 (\$200,900 as compared to \$182,617), as budgeted. (*Page 3*)
- **Total Committee Expenses** for 2006 are **\$31,876** more than in August 2005 (\$184,437 as compared to \$152,562), as budgeted. (*Page 3*)
- **The Gleneagles Property subsidiary budget** (*Page 4*) shows a surplus of **\$17,059**. This is due to a transfer of \$24,248 from Church Development's budget in the operating budget to fund the subsidiary budget for the remainder of 2006.
- **The Burnamwood subsidiary budget** (*Page 4*) shows a deficit of **\$22,131**. The total amount of Unified allocated for the Burnamwood subsidiary budget as of August 2006 is **\$40,308**. Burnamwood gifts in 2006 are \$42,487 as compared to \$81,108 in August 2005. Burnamwood Special Sunday offerings from churches are still in progress.
- **The Undesignated reserves spreadsheet** (*Page 7*) shows a deficit total of \$14,321 as of August 31, 2006. This means that the presbytery has used \$14,321 of the required four months of operating reserves. These reserves came from undesignated income when the presbytery had surpluses in previous year's operating budgets.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR ACTION

COM recommends that the Transylvania Presbytery receive into membership *Lisa Eye* and approve her call as Associate Pastor to *The Presbyterian Church, Danville, pending approval of the congregation*. Effective date is October 1, 2006. Terms: Salary \$43,000, Deferred compensation \$4,620, Medical/Dental Reimbursement Allowance \$7,980, Moving expenses not to exceed \$2,500, Cost for attendance at First Call seminar, \$250, Travel expense @ .445 per mile \$3,000, Continuing Ed \$1,200. Annual vacation 4 weeks, continuing education leave, 2 weeks.

COM recommends that the Presbytery elect an Administrative Commission of seven persons be appointed to temporarily assume jurisdiction of the Manchester Church in order to assist the church in establishing legitimate governance of the church and that the commission be instructed to secure whatever records are available, ascertain who, if any are present members, elders, members of the Session, and to recommend appropriate action to the Presbytery. The commission shall consist of Claire Brooks, Joanna Busroe, Harold Campbell, Jackie Lindberg, Barbara Morgan, Bill Putman and Bill Young.

COM moves that Scott Weist be appointed to serve as moderator of the Drift PC.
