Cookies^[1], also known as Persistence, are the most popular way that Websites remember your details and preferences on the internet, in some cases cookies may need to be enabled. Cookies are stored on your computer and are found in all major browsers, such as Internet Explorer, Firefox, Chrome, Opera, and Safari. Cookies can only be read by the website that asked your browser to store them, and they allow the websites to treat your computer as a returning visitor, otherwise it has no way of knowing if you're a new visitor every time you view another page on the website. Interactive websites usually require cookies, or else they must place a unique identifier in every link on their site to accomplish the same goal, but that doesn't allow you to re-visit the page the next day and have it be in the same state, so cookies are indeed a much better option for most websites.

Method 1 of 8: Google Chrome 10.x (PC)

1 Click the "customize and control" menu at the top right.

2 Click the "Settings" controls. A new tab will automatically open.

3 Click on "Show advanced settings..." near the bottom of the page.

4 Click on "Content settings..."

5 Under "Cookies," make sure that "Allow local data to be set (recommended)" is selected.

6 Click "Done."

Method 2 of 8: Google Chrome 10.x (Mac OSX)

1 Click the Chrome menu

2 Select Settings.

3 Click on "Show advanced settings...." near the bottom of the page.

4 Click Content Settings

5 Click 'Allow local data to be set'

Method 3 of 8: Firefox

1 Click the Firefox menu up top left. (On a Mac, click the Firefox menu.)

2 Select "Options", and then "Options" again. (On a Mac, select Preferences.)

3 Click the Privacy tab.

4 Click the "Firefox will..." dropdown and select "use custom settings for history".

5 Select the "Accept cookies from sites" checkbox.

Click the OK button.

Method 4 of 8: Internet Explorer

1 Click the Tools menu top right. It will look like a gear icon.

2 Select "Internet Options."

3 Click the Privacy tab.

4 Click the "Default" button (or manually slide the bar down to 'Medium').

- If you want to manually adjust your options, click the "Advanced" button to the left of "Default". This will give you more options for customization.

5 Click the "OK" button.

Method 5 of 8: Apple Safari for Mac

1 Click the "Safari" dropdown in the top left of your screen and select "Preferences"

2 Click the Privacy tab.

3 In the "Block Cookies" section, select "Never."

Method 6 of 8: Safari for iPhone, iPad and iPod Touch

1 Go to the settings app

2 Go to the category called safari

3 Go to the part that says accept cookies _____ from whatever your settings are. Default is never.

4 Pick what you want, always, from visited or never

5 Your new settings have been applied. Enjoy the stay logged in feature and other features that require cookies.

Method 7 of 8: Opera

1 Click on the "Opera" menu at the top left of the browser.

2 Select "Settings"

3 Choose the "Private and Security" tab.

4 Under "Cookies," make sure that "Allow local data to be set (recommended)" is selected.

Method 8 of 8: Netscape Navigator

1 Select "Tools" from the top menu.

2 Choose "Option".

3 Choose "Privacy".

4 Check "Accept Cookies from site" and click OK.
