The day is divided among small group activities and various learning centers as well as attending special classes. The majority of the curriculum is spent learning language arts, math and science.

- **LANGUAGE ARTS** The reading/language arts program, Beginning to Read, Write, and Listen, provides multi-sensory initial skills development for the strongest start in the area of language arts. DIBELS (Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills) is an assessment instrument that measures phonemic awareness in students. The *D'Nealian* handwriting form is used.
- **SCIENCE, HEALTH, AND SOCIAL STUDIES** are taught through literature as various topics relate to the letter or sight word of the week. Daily safety and health rules are practiced. Elements of the American way of life and our roles as citizens are identified. Field trips and guest speakers enhance this curriculum.
- **MATH** An understanding of numbers is developed through the use of concrete and hands-on materials. These activities lay the foundation for symbolic understanding and help children develop confidence in their mathematical abilities.
- **CENTERS** Individual and group areas give the children free time and opportunities to make choices and develop personal and social skills. Activities are designed to enrich and extend language arts and math. Areas of choice include painting, reading, home center, listening center with records and cassettes, blocks, puzzles, math, manipulatives, and reading games.
