Palm Sunday – The Sunday of the Passion

Sat., March 24th (5 p.m.) & Sun., March 25th (8 & 10:30 a.m.)

Monday in Holy Week: March 26th – 6:00 p.m. “A Visible Truth”

Explore with Dr. Anne-Marie Bouché the artistic and spiritual relationship between the Incarnation and the Passion of Christ.

Maundy Thursday: March 29th – 5:00 p.m.

“Maundy” is derived from the Latin *mandatum novum* meaning “new commandment.” This is a service of the Washing of the Feet, Holy Eucharist, and the Stripping of the Altar. The Reserved Sacrament will be placed in the Angel Chapel for an all-night vigil for anyone wishing to come and pray.

Good Friday: March 30th – 12:00 Noon

This liturgy, commemorating the crucifixion of Jesus Christ, includes the Passion Gospel, solemn collects (dating from ancient Rome), and Holy Communion from the Reserved Sacrament from Maundy Thursday’s Eucharist.

Holy Saturday: March 31st – 5:00 p.m.

The Book of Common Prayer offers us a service of scripture, a spoken anthem, and the Lord’s Prayer for this first service on Holy Saturday with Eucharist. Following the service, there will be a potluck supper.

The Great Vigil of Easter

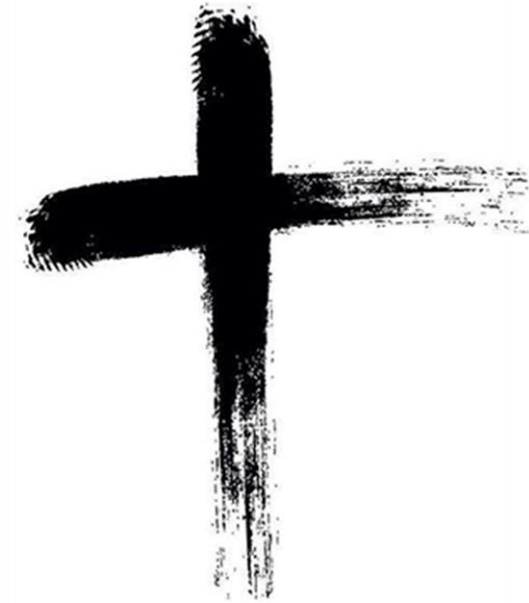
Saturday, March 31st – 8:00 p.m.
