Last weekend eighteen youth and five adults from Roxboro Baptist loaded up the buses and headed to the mountains of West Virginia for our annual ski retreat! One year ago the retreat was my first overnight trip with this group, and this year's trip truly reminded me how much we have grown. Yes, we had a higher number of attendees, but I have seen an even more important growth. We have grown out (five of the eighteen youth are regular group members whose families are not a part of Roxboro Baptist otherwise), and we have grown up (I can see a rise in personal and spiritual maturity as well as deepening group dynamics). We are in no way perfect, but I am very pleased with the direction in which we are heading. Personally, the love I have for these young people and all they bring to the world has also grown in the past year.

This retreat is sponsored by CBF of North Carolina, and our theme this year was "Called Together." Through the story of Ruth and Naomi we learned that we—the Church, our church, the youth group, our communities, etc.—are so much better when we work together in faithful love. This does not mean a call to homogeneity, but rather a way of seeking communal wellness over personal gain. It was a fitting message for youth who are in a constant state of trying to find their place in the world, but also a message that we can all learn from.

Upon returning I was struck by this quote from Dr. Amy Fast: "I am a better person for being around teenagers... not because they test me, but because they have this perfect balance of unapologetic and fiery strength, and unfiltered raw vulnerability. They are beautiful examples of aliveness. We should all strive for a little more of that." The cliché that I learn as much from them as they learn from me rings true. We have some wonderful young people here at RBC, and if you don't know them well I encourage you to meet them, talk with them, and build a relationship with them; because we are all, no matter what our age, "Called Together".




Dental & Vision Clinic
