### Celebrating with Word and Song: Liturgy and music workshops for the Diocese of North Carolina

The Liturgical Commission and the School of Ministry have joined hands in planning for a series of three workshops during 2009 on liturgy and music. While they are held in three different regions of our diocese, they are *not* regional events. Each has its own particular emphasis and topics, and clergy and church musicians are invited to attend any or all.

**Clergy and musicians working together** is the title we have given to our first program, to be held at **St. Paul's in Winston-Salem, March 21, 2009.** Workshops will include "Singing the Psalms" and "Clergy and musicians working together."

**Contemporary worship and liturgical planning** are the two themes of our second program, to be held at **Christ Church in Charlotte, June 6, 2009.**

**Singing! Clergy, cantors, and the RCL** is the thrust of the third workshop, to be held at **St. Mark's in Raleigh, September 26, 2009.**

Workshops will include "Clergy singing services," "The Role of the church cantor," "Anthems with the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL)," and "Preaching from the RCL."

Most workshops will be led by staff from the Leadership Program for Musicians (LPM), and all will include an introduction to LPM. Information about our workshop leaders appears elsewhere in this brochure.

The Leadership Program for Musicians provides on-going education to anyone interested in music and liturgy in the church, and equips church musicians, especially those serving smaller congregations, with vital skills.
