Lucy yawned, sipping her orange juice, when a page of colorful ads featuring crosses and lilies caught her eye. “Those are pretty and bright,” she thought to herself, and looked closer to see what they were advertising: church services. For Easter.

“How about we go to church for Easter tomorrow?” Lucy asked her parents.

The question caught Lucy’s mother with a mouthful of pancake. She swallowed hard, surprised, and looked at Lucy’s father as if to say, “You handle this one.”

“Alright, Luce. We’ll go to Easter service,” said Lucy’s father.

“We will?” asked Lucy’s mother. Though neither of Lucy’s parents had really been to worship since they were children, Lucy’s mother thought she was doing a fine job raising her children in the Church of Be Nice to Others and Say Please and Thank You.

“Sure,” said Lucy’s dad. “Let me see those ads.” He paused for a moment to inspect the tiny rectangles filled with information about all kinds of churches. *Mass, Joyful Worship, Holy Eucharist.* He didn’t know what those things meant, and the ads all seemed to blend together until something caught his eye: Sunrise Service on the Beach. He knew what that meant, and it sounded nice.

“Let’s go to sunrise service on the beach,” he said to Lucy, who nodded, grinning.

“Do I need to remind you we have a three-year-old?” asked Lucy’s mother.

“You stay home with Mikey,” said Lucy’s father. “Lucy and I will wake up early and go.”

Five a.m. did come early the next day, and the air in

Lucy’s bedroom was chilly as her father came to wake her. Lucy put a jacket over her colorful floral dress—the one she had picked from her closet and deemed her “Easter dress” the night before. She brushed her hair and, sleepy, stumbled into the car with her daddy and rode five miles to the beach park.

When they arrived at the park, there were people near the ocean, on the sand, standing in a circle with flashlights. “That must be it,” said Lucy’s dad, clutching his daughter’s hand. They went to the circle and stood with the people.

Five pastors from local churches stood at the front of the group—two women and three men—Presbyterian, Lutheran, Methodist, Episcopal, and Baptist. One talked about how the world was dark as Jesus laid in his tomb that fateful morning—until he rose, then the world was bright. Another prayed. And another blessed bread and wine, told the people how it symbolized Jesus’s last supper, and began to give bits of bread and sips of wine to the crowd.

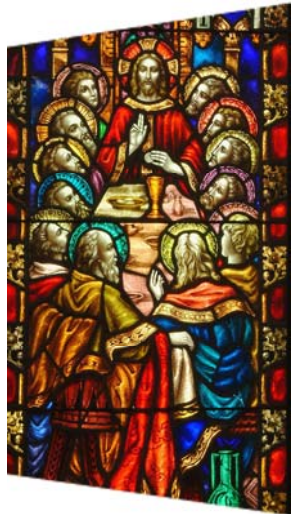

“Daddy,” she said, “If Jesus hadn’t risen from the dead that morning, I suppose the whole world would still be dark today.”

“I think you’re on to something, Luce,” said her father. As Lucy leaned her head against the car window and dozed off, Lucy’s father thought about the rising of Jesus Christ. “If my nine-year-old can believe,” he thought, “maybe I can, too. Maybe we all can.”

Inside *Windows To Our Future*

Ministry and outreach are the central theme of our campaign. For a number of years now Davies Hall has not been a central part of the life of the Cathedral because of its deteriorated condition.

Wiring is exposed, plaster is crumbling, appliances in the kitchen don't work, lighting is poor, rest room facilities are inadequate, it feels dirty, and in case you had not noticed it just plain gets hot in there. The Choir and the music department have fled from their inadequate headquarters in the basement.

Nevertheless, if you walk through Davies you will see that it is a very graceful space and that the bones of the building are excellent. When it was conceived and built, Davies Hall was a center of church activity. Receptions and church dinners were held there. Meetings took place. It was something to be proud of and something to show off. But time has taken its toll on the building, and it is not that today.

When we renovate Davies Hall, all of the inadequacies that now exist will be repaired or restored. The interior will be cleaned up and new lighting added. New storage will be available. The building will be air conditioned. The kitchen will be renovated to a state of the art facility. There will be more rest rooms.

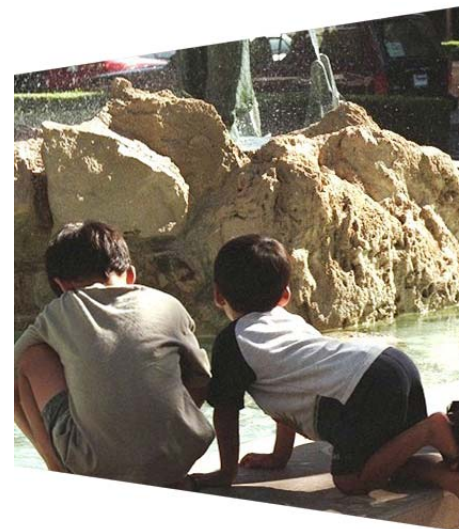
Suddenly, we will have a facility that will permit us to expand the ministries that we offer while at the

same time offering to the downtown Honolulu community a unique, attractive, and gracious space for meetings and gatherings.

Anyone trying to schedule an event at St. Andrew's these days knows that it is always difficult to find available space for a meeting. The competition for the few spaces that we do have available is intense and frustrating—creating a number of issues for our Facilities Coordinator, and challenging him to be extremely flexible, creative, and resourceful.

Our inability to make use of Davies has forced us to adapt the other available space that we do have to try to meet the needs of the church and the congregation. The Choir has occupied the old conference room, with the result that we are now using a space on the second floor of the Memorial Building for most small meetings. Meetings that involve more than a few people must either use the Von Holt room or go begging over at the Priory. The space limitations make it difficult for our various groups, ministries and committees to meet and go about their business.

This campaign will restore and expand the ministries that St. Andrew's presently offers and provide a space that will act as a platform for new and exciting possibilities for both Honolulu and our Episcopal community. It will permit us to turn our face back to the community and to welcome all to a place and a facility of which each one of us can be proud. Please join us in this effort.

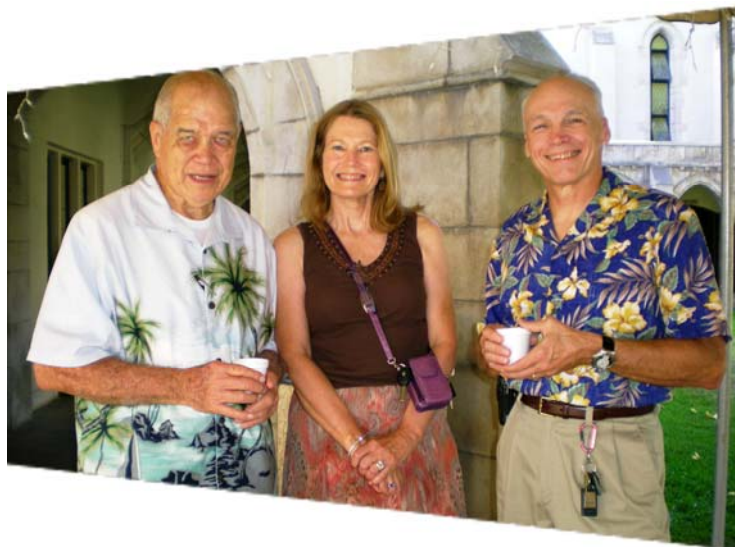

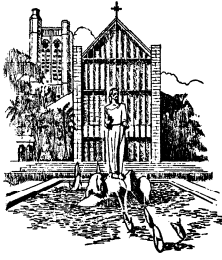
