The Windows To Our Future Campaign Committee is pleased to report that our efforts with the State Legislature were successful, and St. Andrew's has received a grant in the amount of \$500,000 to help fund the renovation of Davies Hall. In these difficult financial times, it is miraculous that we were able to get any money at all, and everyone at the Cathedral owes a debt of thanks to the members of the Government Relations Committee who tirelessly advocated with members of the legislature on behalf of St. Andrew's. Thanks should be extended to Bishop Bob Fitzpatrick, Hartwell and Lei Lee Loy, Melvia Kawashima, and Chris O'Brien for all their hard work. Special thanks are due to Barry Shain and Erin Hoff for all the counsel, guidance, advice and support that they provided throughout our effort.

In addition to our efforts with the Legislature, we have also completed the first phase of the solicitation of the congregation. Many of our fellow congregants have extended themselves to commit to this project. Solicitations will continue through the next few months, and members of the congregation will be asked to attend special meetings where we will provide a rare glimpse of some of the rare treasures from our archives and also explain the need for restoration in Davies

Hall and the Cathedral.

We are continuing to submit applications to various charitable foundations for grants to support this work. This effort will continue throughout the year as the foundations have different time periods when they accept applications for grants. The corporate phase of our campaign is about to kick off and we are extremely fortunate to have that effort spearheaded by Dr. Michael Chun, David Hulihee and Fred Trotter.

We are continuing to pursue a grant from Save America's Treasures, a program of the National Parks Service dedicated to preserving historic entities in the United States. Chapter has authorized us to do what is needed to upgrade our status on the National Register of Historic Buildings from one of "State Significance" to one of "National Significance"; doing so will make us eligible to receive an SAT grant. At the same time, we will be continuing our effort to get our grant application accepted and approved.

At the present time we have raised approximately \$730,000 from all sources and if outstanding grants are approved we should be past the \$1,000,000 mark. Much work has been done, but much remains. We urge all members of the congregation to contribute to this worthy effort.

Focusing above: jubilation streamers

An interview by Joe Woodard with Linda Beauregard-Axelson,
head of the Cathedral Jubilation Streamer Ministry

JW: What is the history and significance of the Jubilation Streamers Ministry world-wide, nationally, and at the Cathedral of St. Andrew?

LB-A: I've done some research, and found online discussions about banners, flags and streamers in that they are used as objects of proclamation. The basic technique of flags or streamers waving is not new. We see such displays in the world in rhythmic gymnastics or in marching bands. Used in accordance to the Word, flags become

the primary sign for lifting up a "standard" of God. The Bible refers to the word flag as "standard" or "banner." Standard is defined as a banner used as an emblem, marker or rallying point; an ensign; military or personal flag. In the Old Testament, God commands Moses to instruct the children of Israel to camp by their own "standard" to signify their tribe. (Numbers 2:2) There were 12 different flags or banners for the 12 tribes. (Numbers 1:52, 2:2-3, 10, 18, 25; 10:14- 25)

JW: The pole looks heavy!

LB-A: Initially, I discovered that while the pole itself it not heavy per se, the flexibility and movement of the ribbons make for a special feel of top-heavy weight. It took me some time to get a comfort level with managing the length and weight to create the patterns and fill the space. Once the streamers are in movement, I completely forget the weight of the pole. My focus turns to raising the jubilation streamers up high in the house of God, which may help us to focus high, far beyond ourselves, to open our hearts and minds to a more meaningful level of worship.

JW- Where did you learn to handle the jubilation streamers, and what kind of skills and training does it take?



LB-A: Linda: I was blessed with a brief training session by Natasha Dator, who has brought much depth of feeling and exuberance to the use of the jubilation streamers for quite some time. I am happy to have taken on the responsibility and find that my background as a dance instructor and musician has equipped me with the basic skills: upper body strength and stamina, very good balance, and a strong sense of timing.

JW: I notice that The Streamer is not performed during certain times and that the colors of the streamers change with seasons. What are the protocols?

LB-A: My understanding is that the jubilation streamers are flown during feast days. We have several sets of colored streamers, which are most appropriately matched up to the liturgical calendar. Universally recognized colors are red (blood), purple (royalty), blue (heavenly), gold (deity), silver (redemption), brass (suffering), white (purity), and rainbow colors (covenant).

JW: Are jubilation streamer recruits needed? This seems like an ideal opportunity for youth since it does take stamina!

LB-A: At the end of each service, many of the congregants and visitors share with me that the streamers do impart a true feeling of jubilation and beauty. It is such a joyful ministry and while it does take measurable ability to master, it is an experience that I personally wish to share with every congregant who would like to give it a try. Each of those who have recently begun training, have had a very moving experience.

Of course we are always looking for more volunteers and it is an ideal way for youth to meaningfully participate in the liturgy, but all members are welcome. They can contact me at (808) 753-2440 for more information about participation with the jubilation streamers.

Student Formation

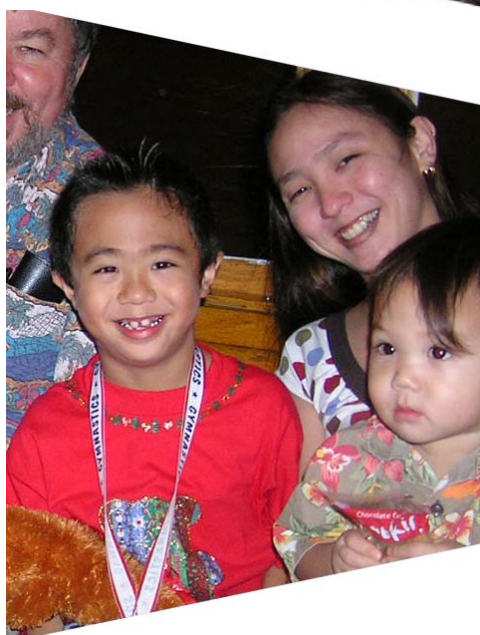

Introducing gift annuities

A Charitable Gift Annuity (CGA) is a contract between the Cathedral and you to make fixed, annual lifetime payments to you (and another if you choose). A CGA can benefit one or two individuals. CGAs are regulated by Hawaii law and are subject to statutory reserve requirements and investment rules. The annuity rate is drawn from an approved table of rates based on the life expectancy of the annuitant(s). For example, under current tables, payments for a single lifetime, beginning at age 70, will be at a fixed rate of 5.7%. The gift will generate a current income tax charitable deduction for itemizers. After the last payment has been made, the Cathedral will have access to the remaining funds for its programs.

If the annuity is purchased with cash, the income distributed each year will be paid to the annuitant(s) as both ordinary and tax-exempt income. In the example of the 70 year old annuitant, 67.2% of the annual annuity amount is paid to him/her tax-free for the first 15.9 years.

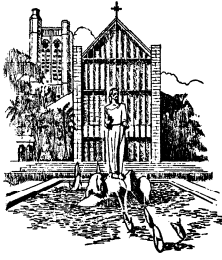
