### Something to remember, especially during Lent

When Philip Johnson, renowned architect and designer of the Crystal Cathedral in California, was just 13, his family took him to France. When they entered the cathedral at Chartres, Philip was so moved by the majesty and beauty of the building dedicated to God that he burst into tears.

I have also shed tears in a church. I wept when I felt the nudging presence of God pointing me toward the ministry. I wept when I was ordained. I wept when I retired after serving as a pastor for 38 years.

I have seen people weep at the altar rail. I have seen brides cry during the marriage ceremony. I have observed people weeping at funerals and sometimes at the baptism of a child. I recall a man saying to me, "I cried during the sermon. Do you know that what you preach can sometimes make a person cry?"

To weep before God is to be in good company. Job said, "My eye pours out tears to God" (Job 16:20, NRSV). A psalmist prayed, "Hear my prayer, O Lord, and give ear to my cry; do not hold your peace at my tears" (Psalm 39:12, NRSV). Read Jeremiah 9 and you will understand why he is called "the weeping prophet."

Jesus wept over the wretched status of Jerusalem where he was spurned (Luke 19:41). He also wept when his friend Lazarus died (John 11:35). St. Paul wrote to the Corinthians, "I wrote you out of much distress and anguish of heart and with many tears" (2 Corinthians 2:4, NRSV).

The point is this: When you are moved to cry before God, cry. People with caring hearts do that. This is something to remember, especially during Lent.

## Inside *Windows To Our Future*

We have been very busy since the start of the year. On January 20 Bishop Fitzpatrick chaired a campaign meeting in his office. In attendance were Provost Tim Sexton, Campaign Co-Chair Susan Hays, Campaign Vice Chair Frank O'Brien, consultant Barry Shain, and Provost's Assistant Erin Hoff.

On January 27, we had an organizational meeting for the Government Relations Sub-Committee. In attendance were Frank O'Brien, Melvia Kawashima, Hartwell Lee Loy, Lei Lee Loy, Chris O'Brien, Barry Shain, and Erin Hoff.

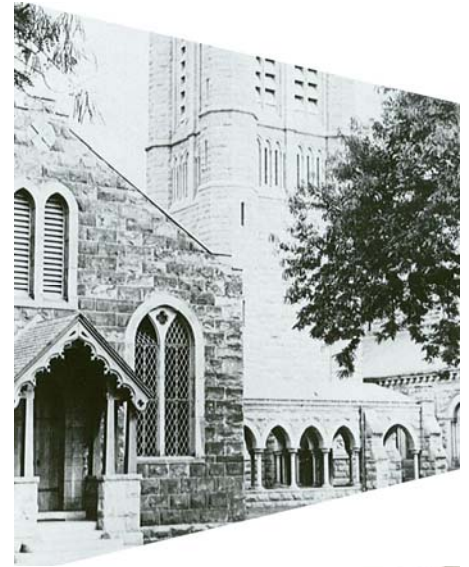
On February 4, we had a meeting of the general committee to discuss the campaign and provide major gifts training. In attendance were Bishop Bob Fitzpatrick, Provost Tim Sexton, Susan Hays, Chris O'Brien, Cynthia Carson, Eunice DeMello, Melvia Kawashima, Kevin Herring, Hartwell Lee Loy, Lei Lee Loy, John Hays, Susan Hays, Paulie Jennings, John Condrey, Frank O'Brien, consultants Neal Myerberg and Barry Shain.

Frank O'Brien, Barry Shain, and Erin Hoff meet twice a month to discuss strategy and logistical issues related to the campaign, and Frank O'Brien and Barry Shain meet with the Bishop on a regular basis to keep him up to date with regard to the progress of the campaign. Members of the committee are updated on actions and developments on a regular basis by email. Regular reports to the congregation will be included in the *The Net* ("the e-news") and *Ka`Upena*.

We submitted a grant request to the legislature on January 26. We are requesting \$1.5 million so work can commence on Davies Hall. During the next two months, members of the Government Relations Committee will schedule meetings with different members of the State House and Senate to inform them about the purpose and scope of the campaign. The Bishop also will meet with members of the legislature to solicit their support. Key members of the legislature were contacted before the start of the session to alert them to our need and we have already made follow-up visits.

We had submitted a grant request to Save America's Treasures. In advance of this request we had contacted the members of our federal congressional delegation and obtained their unanimous support for the request. Save America's Treasures has denied the request. We are confused by the reason stated for the denial and so we are investigating to find out exactly why we were denied and whether the denial was the result of some misunderstanding on the part of those who review the proposed projects. Once we have this information, we intend to resubmit the request.

We will soon be soliciting the entire congregation asking for their participation in the campaign. We are asking everyone to support this effort and urge all within their acquaintance to contribute to the best of their ability.

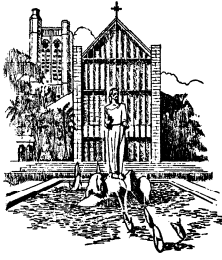

Music of the Taizé community in France is the centerpiece of *Evensong*, a contemplative, half-hour service...perfect way to "unwind" at the end of the workday and avoid rush-hour traffic!

*Compline* is a simple evening service that asks for God's protection during the night to come. The Cathedral is glad to offer Sung Compline during Lent, the season during which the Church and its people prepare for Easter.
