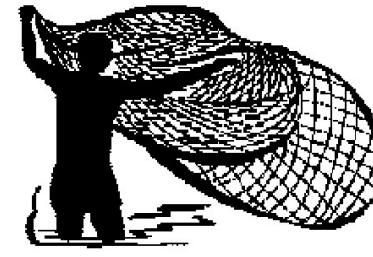

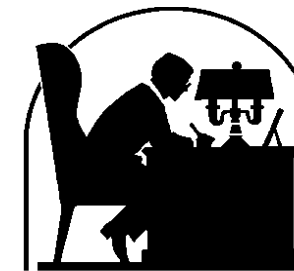

(they) got there." Eight-mile treks turned into twelve miles and one thousand foot rises turned out to be fifteen hundred.

In the recent newsletter of the Cathedral of St. Phillip, Atlanta, GA. The Rev. George Maxwell Jr., Vicar & Canon for Congregational Life writes about his experience of taking a weeklong trip through a wilderness area in Montana. He describes the difficulty his group had with their guide's inability to "tell (them) exactly how far (they) needed to go the next day and how high (they) would be when

He says, "Our guide didn't seem to be as interested in mastering the wilderness as he was in being mastered by it...He was constantly scanning the hillsides for clusters of wildflowers or patches of huckleberries. He insisted on stopping at each stream to see how the melting of the winter snow had altered its course. He never passed evidence

of animals on the trail without looking to see what they were eating and where they were going. And he had no qualms about changing our plans – adding impromptu side trips or finding another campsite – based on what he saw... his awareness meant that we all experienced a wilderness that we might have missed if we had focused only on how many miles we had to go or how many feet we had to climb."

## WHAT DID YOU EXPECT OF QUEEN LILIUOKALANI ON HER 60<sup>TH</sup> BIRTHDAY?

After researching all of the fine qualities our beloved Queen Liliuokalani possessed, I believe her greatest legacy to all of us is "her offering of forgiveness and the grace she exhibited to those linked with the annexation of Hawaii on August 12, 1898." To demonstrate this rare quality of "forgiveness," let me share a little bit of what it was like at the Queen's 60<sup>th</sup> birthday at Washington Place on September 2, 1898 as described by Bernice Piilani Irwin, a close friend of the Queen, in her book *I Knew*

To fully capture the essence of the Queen's 60<sup>th</sup> birthday, let me roll back first to August 12, 1898,

when ceremonies for the United States to "formally" take possession of Hawaii were scheduled to be held at Iolani Palace. Native leaders such as Queen Liliuokalani, her niece, Princess Kaiulani, and Prince Kuhio, although invited, did not attend the ceremonies. No native Hawaiians likewise attended.

The Queen, however, decided to make her first public appearance at Washington Place 3 weeks later on the occasion of her 60<sup>th</sup> birthday. Hundreds of people from all walks of life arrived at 10 a.m. that morning. The Queen looked very regal in white as she stood in the Reception Line with Princess Kaiulani. Everyone who came approached the Queen on their knees, presented their **ho'okupu** (gifts), kissed her hand, and then backed out of her presence in the same manner. Some of the Hawaiians, as they entered the room, chanted the genealogy of the Queen's family.

Members of the Annexation Commission also called. The

Queen was most gracious in her manner to them. According to Ms. Irwin, "it must have touched them to see the loyalty and devotion of these people for their beloved Queen." On the same evening, Queen Liliuokalani's secretary invited the young members of the Annexation Commission to a luau to which the Queen was present. She was dressed in a most becoming blue silk princess gown as she graciously greeted the young men informally.

Queen Liliuokalani's ability to "forgive" is immeasurable. She was highly intelligent, she spoke Hawaiian, English and studied Greek, Latin and French; cared very much for her people, especially the children of Hawaii; wrote over 200 songs, and played the autoharp, piano, organ, guitar. What a gifted individual our beloved Queen Liliuokalani was, despite accusations of treason and being illegally imprisoned in her own palace. And, yet, 3 weeks after the annexation of Hawaii to the United States, Queen Liliuokalani graciously accepted the Annexation Commission to her home! What did you expect of Queen Liliuokalani on her 60<sup>th</sup> birthday? Therefore, for all that our Queen endured, let's all sing her praises by participating
