Wally, born in Washington state, spent some of his growing up years in Mexico where his parents were working with Mission Aviation Fellowship(MAF). After his high school years at Corn Bible Academy in Oklahoma, and after a stint at college in Washington, Wally moved to Hawaii to start a construction business. It was during his years in Hawaii that he became involved with Youth with a Mission and made the decision to rededicate his life to the Lord. In 1976 Wally joined MAF as a builder and was sent to Papua, Indonesia (at that time known as Irian Jaya).

Joan grew up in a Christian home in New Jersey and felt called to be a missionary while she was in junior high school. She graduated from Gordon College with a degree in Education and then got a master's degree in Language Arts from William Paterson College. In 1974 Joan joined Wycliffe Bible Translators and was sent to Metla, Mexico, where she taught missionary children and also where she met Wally.

In 1978 Joan and Wally were married. They spent a short time in Ecuador with MAF, then returned to Indonesia, first in Kalimantan (Borneo) and then back in Papua. Currently Wally is MAF's Indonesia Regional Manager over MAF's largest program in the world. He is also the founder of a school for Papuan children. Joan teaches English at a missionary high school in Papua. They have two married children, Jacinda and Jared.
