Communion will be offered by intinction. There are four stations: two at the altar rail and two by the chancel steps. The ushers will invite you to come forward by the center aisle and return to your seat by the side aisles.

To receive the wafer extend your hand, palm up, and then lightly touch the wafer to the burgundy wine, or the white colored grape juice held by the assistant. If you would like the pastor to place the elements on your tongue, fold your hands and keep them folded in front of you.

Children who have not received communion instruction are invited to come forward with their parents for a blessing, folding their arms across their chests as a signal to the pastor.

Communion will be served in the pews to those who cannot come forward; please inform an usher. Gluten free wafers are available.

June is Member Care month and this week we highlight Stephen Ministry, Prayer Ministry and Grief Support, and the Labyrinth. Through these ministries, we share God's love and offer Christian support to fellow members during daily life and significant times. **Prayer Ministry** lifts up the concerns submitted on prayer cards during Sunday worship and sponsors retreats that strengthen and revitalize the prayer lives of our members. **Stephen Ministers** are a wonderful resource for support and Christian caring whom you may call upon whenever life becomes challenging. Talking with or serving as a Stephen Minister will deepen your faith. **Labyrinths** are pathways, circular patterns with a single winding path into the center and back out again. It is a tool for reflection, contemplation, prayer, celebration, joy, problem solving and personal growth. Often it is seen as a metaphor, or a symbol, for the journey of life.

Redeemer's Labyrinth is a portable canvas style with a new design called the Santa Rosa pattern – seven circuits, or turns, which create a cruciform shape. The circle and the cross are among the most elemental of symbols, known by peoples from pre-history to the present. Our Labyrinth was purchased by the women of the WELCA Circles and was dedicated on November 11, 2001. Labyrinth Walks are scheduled the 4th Wednesday of the month from noon until 8:00 p.m., except this month. To commemorate Member Care Month, our Labyrinth will be introduced to the Sunday School children today in a special Children's Walk. Stop by the Member Care table or speak with a Stephen Minister wearing a blue name badge.
