## HOLY WEEK AND EASTER SUNDAY 2007

**Palm (or Passion) Sunday, April 1, 9:00 & 11:00 AM** will feature the Procession with Palm fronds as worship begins. This becomes a dramatic reenactment of our Lord's triumphal entry into Jerusalem, with shouts of "Hosanna! Blessed is He that comes in the name of the Lord!" just as it began the first Holy Week or Passion of Jesus, the Messiah.

*John's Gospel devotes eight of its twenty-one chapters to Holy Week alone. With Palm Sunday we begin the experience of the most meaningful and dramatic reenactments of the life, death, and resurrection of our Lord.*

**Maundy Thursday, April 5<sup>th</sup>, 7:00 PM** is Service of the Last Supper, which commemorates Jesus' last meal with the disciples, the betrayal of Judas, and our Lord's institution of the Lord's Supper as a Sacrament (we will celebrate the Lord's Supper by Intinction). The service begins the *Triduum*, or three day period from sunset on Thursday to sunset on Easter. The name, "Maundy Thursday" comes from the Latin *mandatum novum*, referring to the "new commandment" Jesus taught his disciples (John 13:34). It might well be called, "New Commandment Thursday."

*Again, will be the dramatic re-creation of the Last Supper in tableau.*

**Good Friday Tenebrae Service, April 6<sup>th</sup>, 7:00 PM** – Worship will include *Tenebrae* (which is Latin for shadows) is a service of growing darkness during which we experience the emotions of the passion story and death of Christ as told in the Gospels. The purpose of the Service is to recreate the betrayal, abandonment, and agony of the events surrounding the Cross.

*For those who received nails on Ash Wednesday, please bring them back for this service as we contemplate how we, too, even in this day and age, "nail" Jesus to the Cross.*

**Easter Sunday, the Resurrection of our Lord, April 8<sup>th</sup>, 9:00 & 11:00 AM** – All the hopes and expectations of Christians are realized in this glorious celebration of the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. During this joyful celebration, we experience the great spiritual renewal of our faith in the Crucified but now Resurrected Jesus. Our celebration will feature the Bell and Chancel Choirs, trumpet accompaniment, glorious hymns, the preaching of the Word, and a moving conclusion when we all stand to sing Handel's *Hallelujah Chorus!* (Come early to get a seat.)

Make your plans now to join us for each of the Holy Week services that lead us to the celebration of Easter Sunday 2007!

- ◆ Elder Jason Willard reported from the Celebration Worship Team. The team is close to confirming candidate to serve as the worship leader and hopes to begin Celebration Worship Services in the late summer to early fall.
- ◆ The membership rolls were reviewed and approved.
  
- ◆ Session approved a request for a Letter of Transfer from Roswell Presbyterian Church for Vince, Jane, Corbin, and Anne Parkhouse.
- ◆ Session approved Jenny Scott as a chaperone for the mission trip to Kentucky.
- ◆ Session approved the senior high be allowed to have youth group at Dave & Busters on March 11th.
  
- ◆ Session approved youth leader Joe Walls be allowed to present his “mission bucket” to collect donations to be used to support the youth who are going on the mission trip.

## CHOIR SUNDAY - March 25, 9 and 11 AM

Lent brings our hearts and meditations towards God in reflections of Jesus our Savior. The music in ministry of this season will reflect anthems of remembrance, intercession, humility and salvation. The Eastminster Ringers, with Don Harris accompanying on the organ, will offer "A Mighty Fortress is Our God" on the first Sunday in March. The Youth and Children's choirs will sing the following two Sundays and finally, on March 25<sup>th</sup> the Chancel Choir will offer John Rutter's "*Requiem*". This 20<sup>th</sup> century work is harmonically expressive using both latin mass texts and Psalm texts, sung in English. Setting a "mass for the dead" is one of John Rutter's most beautiful and haunting works, with melodies and instrumentation (harp, oboe, flute, cello, percussion and organ) that enhance our reflection and communicate a mourning and redemptive spirit seeking salvation. We will offer this Choir Sunday "*Requiem*" for both morning services, so please come and appreciate the message through music on March 25<sup>th</sup>.

### EASTER LILIES
