BECOMING A 'MISSIONAL' CHURCH

As the Session gathered at the Dillard House in beautiful Clayton, Georgia, April 20 & 21 for our annual Leadership Retreat, we were in anticipation of what has become a very special time together. We all celebrate that our dream of becoming a Session that works well together as a Team has become a reality. Simply said, we work and play well together because we all share the same mission and vision for Eastminster Presbyterian Church. In fact, it can truly be said that we are passionate about *"Bringing people to Christ"* and *"Building Christian Lives."*

Our Retreat theme was "Elevation Celebration" in keeping with our greatest new ministry undertaking for 2007: the addition of Celebration Worship on Sunday evenings in the fall. *This month we welcome our new Celebration Worship Leader, Chas Childers to our staff. As you read his article on the back of this issue of "Leaps & Bounds," you will see how much must be done for the successful beginning of this dynamic ministry. You will also see that there are even more new ministry opportunities available for us to engage in our Lord's ministry and mission for his church at Eastminster.*

As a Leadership Team, our first step in preparation was *to focus on becoming 'a Missional church' which is "inwardly strong but outwardly focused."* As a church, we have worked hard over the last three years to build an infrastructure of ministries and missions that *"Build Christian Lives"* and offer our members and our visitors multiple opportunities to connect with Christ, to grow in their faith, and to find their unique place in the ministry and mission of our Lord. This is an on-going process and we will continue to work on our goal of becoming a church which is *"inwardly strong."*

Now with the beginning of Celebration Worship, Eastminster also has the opportunity to become a church that is *"outwardly focused."* Here is our opportunity to reach outside of ourselves and share the love of Christ with those outside the stream of a wonderful "traditional church" like ours. *It is important here to emphasize that we are not changing what we already are doing as a church. Rather, we are adding a new dimension to what we already do very well.*

You may have heard me say that the Twenty-First Century is the century of *"the Missional Church."* Just how do we go about becoming *"a Missional Church"*? For a start we must focus on the mission field all around us. *Would it surprise you to know that there are almost 100 Million unchurched people in America today?* Our next question becomes, "How do we build ministry for them? A huge first step is offering Celebration Worship where they will come to feel at home with us and experience a life changing encounter with Jesus Christ. Secondly, we have to become "missionaries" to those with whom we live, work, and play. As we build intentional relationships with the people in our neighborhoods and in our spheres of influence, the Holy Spirit will do what He does best and introduce them to Jesus Christ through our lives. Granted this is only the beginning of what it means to be a *"Missional Church"* but what an important beginning it is.

May the Lord of the Church enable us to become a church that is "inwardly strong but outwardly focused".

CHARITABLE CONTRIBUTIONS FROM IRAs

The Pension Protection Act, signed into law on 8/17/06, made an important change in this area which could favorably impact your stewardship strategy if you are at least 70 ½. Under the Act, an IRA owner may instruct the Custodian to make a distribution directly to a specified charity. If the distribution satisfies the various requirements described below, it is excluded from the IRA owner's income, up to a limit of \$100,000. Previously, an IRA owner could make a withdrawal and contribute the amount withdrawn to the charity, but for some taxpayers the charitable contribution was not fully deductible.

This new rule is available only to IRA owners who are at least age 70 ½ at the time of the distribution and is available only for distributions to a charity during 2006 and 2007. Also, the new rule is available only for distributions from a Traditional IRA or Roth IRA; distributions from a SEP IRA or SIMPLE IRA do not qualify.

The exclusion from income applies only to amounts that, if they were distributed to the IRA owner instead of the charity, would be taxable income to the IRA owner. In other words, the distribution may not include non-deductible contributions or after-tax direct rollover amounts in a Traditional IRA or non-taxable distributions from a Roth IRA. However, in applying this rule, the distribution is deemed to consist of taxable amounts to the extent of all taxable amounts in all of the owner's IRAs. This may affect the tax treatment of subsequent withdrawals.

Also, the distribution must satisfy the normal charitable deduction rules so that it would be entirely deductible if it were a contribution to the charity by the IRA owner. Such a distribution to a charity will count toward meeting the IRA owner's required minimum distribution for that year.

As is apparent, these rules are complex. An IRA owner who is interested in a distribution from his or her IRA directly to an eligible charity is strongly advised to consult a qualified tax advisor.
