HOLY WEEK AND EASTER SUNDAY 2006

Palm (or Passion) Sunday, April 9, 9:00 & 11:00 AM will feature the Procession with Palm fronds as worship begins. This becomes a dramatic reenactment of our Lord's triumphal entry into Jerusalem, with shouts of "Hosanna! Blessed is He that comes in the name of the Lord!" just as it began the first Holy Week or Passion of Jesus, the Messiah.

John's Gospel devotes eight of its twenty-one chapters to Holy Week alone. With Palm Sunday we begin the experience of the most meaningful and dramatic reenactments of the life, death, and resurrection of our Lord.

Maundy Thursday, April 13th, 7:00 PM is Service of the Last Supper, which commemorates Jesus' last meal with the disciples, the betrayal of Judas, and our Lord's institution of the Lord's Supper as a Sacrament (we will celebrate the Lord's Supper by Intinction). The service begins the *Triduum*, or three day period from sunset on Thursday to sunset on Easter. The name, "Maundy Thursday" comes from the Latin *mandatum novum*, referring to the "new commandment" Jesus taught his disciples (John 13:34). It might well be called, "New Commandment Thursday."

New this year, will be the dramatic re-creation of the Last Supper in tableau.

Good Friday Tenebrae Service, April 14th, 7:00 PM – will feature the Chancel Choir offering a special service of Music and Scripture for us to experience the darkest time in the life and death of our Lord Jesus Christ. Worship will conclude with *Tenebrae* (which is Latin for shadows) is a service of growing darkness during which we experience the emotions of the passion story and death of Christ as told in the Gospels. The purpose of the Service is to recreate the betrayal, abandonment, and agony of the events surrounding the Cross.

For those who received nails on Ash Wednesday, please bring them back for this service as we contemplate how we, too, even in this day and age, "nail" Jesus to the Cross.

Easter Sunday, the Resurrection of our Lord, April 16th, 9:00 & 11:00 AM – All the hopes and expectations of Christians are realized in this glorious celebration of the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. During this joyful celebration, we experience the great spiritual renewal of our faith in the Crucified but now Resurrected Jesus. Our celebration will feature the pealing of the bells, trumpet accompaniment, glorious hymns,

the Chancel Choir, the preaching of the Word, and a moving conclusion when we all stand to sing Handel's *Hallelujah Chorus!* (Come early to get a seat.) Appropriately, this is the Celebration Sunday for our *Step in Faith Campaign*.

Make your plans now to join us for each of the Holy Week services that lead us to the celebration of Easter Sunday 2006!

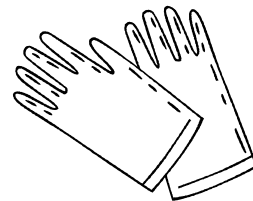

PW RETREAT

Do you find yourself overwhelmed with the number of things that must be done in a day (or even an hour)? Do you find that you are busy, busy, busy -- yet feeling empty at the same time? Perhaps it is not that you are doing the wrong things, but simply too many of the right things. Let's discover together ways to nurture our souls while serving God's people and our families. Take some time to nourish your spirit in a place away with your sisters in Christ on a mountaintop as we discern if we truly are "desperate Marys in an overfunctioning Martha world."

The 2006 PW Spiritual Retreat for Cherokee Presbytery will be the weekend of May 6-7 (concluding about noon Sunday) at Red Top Mountain State Park. If you wish, you can come up Friday the 5th -- Friday evening is optional and very casual, nothing planned except to set up the big room for the weekend events. There will be a \$20 retreat registration fee payable to CPPW when you arrive. Room reservations are to be made directly to Red Top Mountain. Cabins with two bedrooms (2 double beds in each) and kitchen are available. Cabin rental must be for two nights for a total of \$228 plus tax – divided by four is \$57 plus taxes. Please have only one person make reservations for a cabin. Reservations are due by April 5th. Or, you may stay in the Lodge: \$100 plus taxes per room per night whether a single or a double room.

Meals will be on your own. The Lodge serves buffet meals or you may order from the menu. Please add tax and gratuity to these buffet prices: breakfast \$7, lunch \$8, Saturday night Prime Rib \$16. The cabins have full kitchens. If you are coming just for the day on Saturday the cost would be for meal(s) and the \$20 retreat registration fee.

The weekend will include Bible study, worship (offering will be taken), fellowship, and free time. Julia Wiley from Faith Presbyterian will be the speaker for the retreat. Her topic will be "Desperate Marys in an Overfunctioning Martha World" using Luke 10:38-42 and portions of the Psalms.
