2007 – AN AMAZING YEAR FOR EPC!

In 2007 we saw that dreams can come true when we work well together and everyone does their part. As we all know, things don't just happen on their own. They are the results of intentional planning, hard work and diligent leadership of Session and Staff and Ministry Teams over the years. Most of all, it is the result of our Lord honoring our growing desire to know and join Him in His ministry and mission through His church (Matthew 28:18-20).

As we look back, we see that each year has brought its own unique emphasis and accomplishments:

2004 saw the building of our outer parking lot and the hard work of strategic planning and discovery process which produced stronger identity and definition for EPC with core values, mission and vision statements to guide us into the future.

2005 produced a successful capital campaign to build a new multipurpose building to enable Eastminster to move to the next level in our Lord's ministries and missions through his church.

2006 brought the launching of three Search Committees for key staff positions: 1) a full time Director of Christian Education; 2) an Associate Pastor; and 3) a Worship Leader for Contemporary Worship.

In **2007** we witnessed –

- ♦ *Allison Hayes (soon to become Scholtens)* becoming Eastminster's first full time Director of Christian Education and Youth & Children's Ministries;
- ♦ *Dr. Chas Childers* joining our staff as Worship Leader for our new Contemporary Worship Service, THE ROAD;
- ♦ *Reverend Pat Slomanski* being called and installed as EPC's new Associate Pastor;
- ♦ *Suzanne Logue*, a local music teacher accepting a position as our Director of our Children's Choirs;
- ♦ Great progress on the construction of our *new multipurpose building for Christian Education, Youth Ministry, Fellowship Meals and Events, and Contemporary Worship.*

Some may ask "why" we need all of this new staff and such a large addition? The answer is that our Lord has honored His ministry and mission in and through Eastminster. Our ministry and mission activities have quadrupled and we have grown by 55-70 new members each year. With the fine leadership of our Session and the diligent work of our staff and Ministry Teams, we are making great strides in becoming *a Missional Church that is inwardly strong but outwardly focused.* If 2008 is anything like the last four years, it is going to be a great year for our Eastminster church family.

WORK DAY

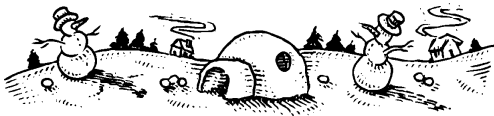
January 19

New Study to Begin in FAITH BUILDERS CLASS

January 7, in Room "C" of Fellowship Hall at 10 AM

Has Christianity changed in this past two thousand years? In the beginning of our faith how much diversity, contrariness, disputes over theology, lack of common belief was there? What were the competing Scriptures that were used and offered by different Christian churches in the early years of our faith? How difficult was it for our believers to deal with theological differences and to give up some closely held beliefs in the quest for unity? What man holding enormous political power at the time called a conference to be held at Nicea in 325 AD to settle theological Christian differences for the goal of unity, strength and growth of our Christian Religion? You may know some or all of the answers to these questions, but if you do not, you are invited to get the answers to these initial questions and much more information that can make you personally more confident of your factual understanding of the early years, decades, and the first two centuries of our faith. We will be taught by PROFESSOR BART D. EHRMAN who is the James A. Gray Professor and Chair of the Department of Religious Studies at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He received his Masters of Divinity and Ph.D. from Princeton Theological Seminary. He has won several teaching awards including the Student's undergraduate Teaching Award for excellence in teaching.
