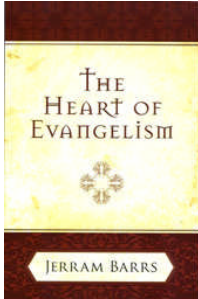

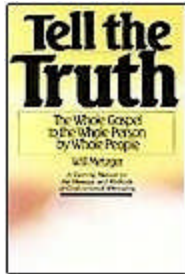


### **The Heart of Evangelism**

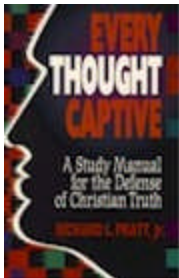

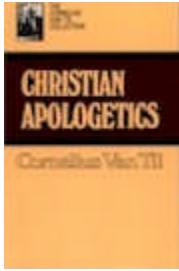

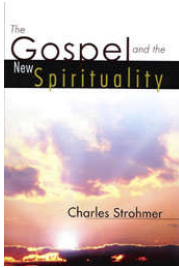
### **Christian Apologetics**
