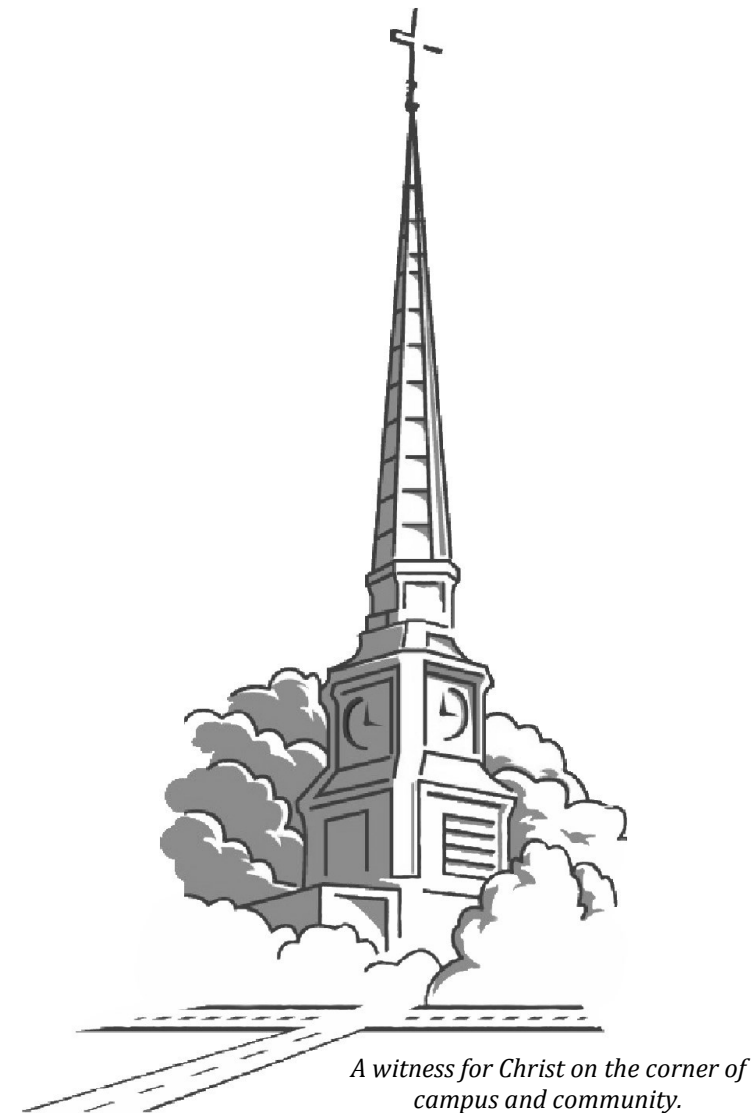

CARITAS ACAPELLA ENSEMBLE presents "Classics Re-Imagined" on Sunday February 12, 2017 at 7 p.m. in the sanctuary. Well-known classics will be paired with a 20th or 21st Century re-imagined version. For example: William Byrd's "Ave Verum Corpus" is paired with Roderick Williams' ethereal "Ave Verum Corpus Re-imagined;" Bach's chorale "Come, Sweet Death" is re-interpreted by Edwin London in "Bach (Again)"; and Thomas Morely's madrigal "My Bonnie Lass She Smileth" is humorously twisted into "My Bonnie Lass She Smelleth" by Peter Schickele under the pen name of P.D.Q. Bach. The mission of CARITAS is "acapella artistry with a purpose," their name being the Latin word for charity. Half of the proceeds from their ticket sales are donated to a worthy charitable organization. The recipient for this concert is Community Culinary School of Charlotte, teaching at-risk adults new culinary skills to help them reintegrate into society - a complete "re-imagining" of real lives. Colombian artist and social activist EDWIN GIL will collaborate with CARITAS by exhibiting 11 pieces of original modern as a part of his series "Diversiview."
