In our baptism God has called and sealed us. Baptism is an important event not simply in the life of the child and family, but in the life of the whole church. We are baptized into a community, and not in abstraction from the community. Today we celebrate the baptism of this child into our community.

Two different musical settings this morning. Each choir has a different musical setting of the same poem, written in 18th-century England, possibly as a carol. The tree of life appears in Revelation 22:1-2 as well as Genesis. There was a tradition of wassailing the health of apple trees on Christmas Eve, and possibly this carol was an effort to Christianize old English winter season songs. The message is that our faith is sustained by and thrives on the fruit of Jesus Christ.
