June 5: The Covenant Class and the Jubilee Class have joined to welcome Dr. Jacqueline Bussie, the Director of the Forum on Faith and Life at Concordia College in Moorhead, MN, and a Phi Beta Kappa, Magna Cum Laude graduate of Davidson College, where she will be celebrating her Twenty-fifth Reunion on this weekend. She holds an MA in Religion from Yale and a Ph.D. in Theology, Ethics and Culture from the University of Virginia.

Dr. Bussie will be introducing us to her splendid new book, *OUTLAW CHRISTIAN: FINDING AUTHENTIC FAITH BY BREAKING THE 'RULES'*, just published by Thomas Nelson, and the recipient of a starred review by Publishers Weekly. The reviewer says, "Bussie writes with poetry, pathos, and pepper as she cheerleads for breaking 'faith-laws.'" 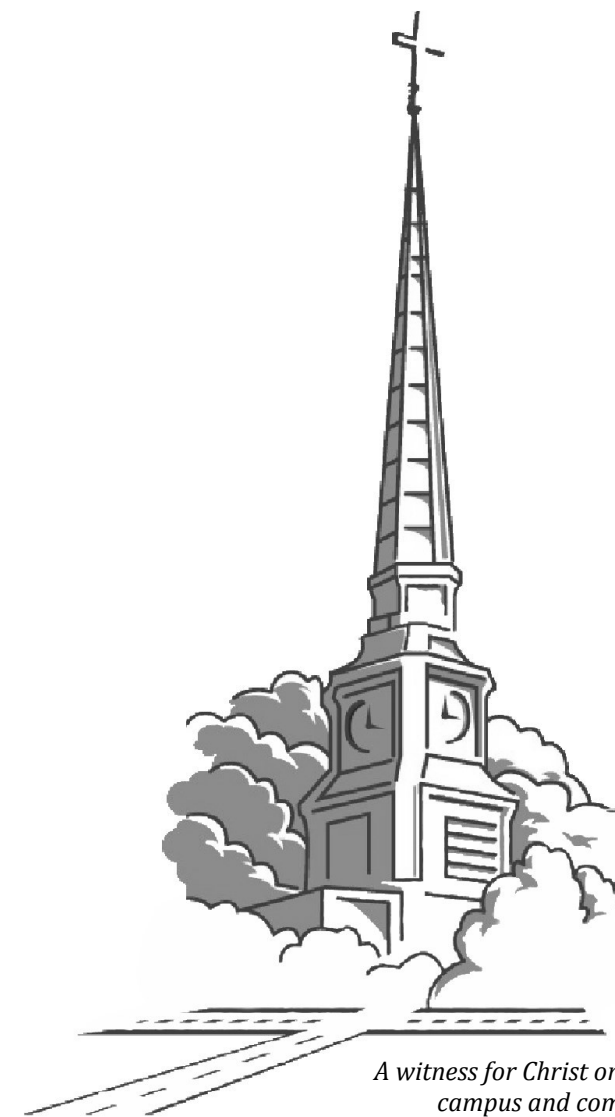
