The church confesses the Scriptures to be the word of God written, witnessing to God's self-revelation in Jesus Christ, the Living Word. Where that word is read and proclaimed, Jesus Christ the Living Word is present by the inward witness of the Holy Spirit. For this reason the reading, hearing, preaching, and confessing of the Word are central to Christian worship.

The first two stanzas of this hymn refer to events in Christ's ministry, feeding the five thousand and the Lord's Supper. Stanza three moves to the present, reminding us of the centrality of Word and Table. The final stanza moves us out into the future, a prayer that we will share the Bread of Life with all.
