Looking Toward this Sunday April 15, 2018

Scripture: Luke 24: 36b-48

Sermon: Faith in an Age of Fear

Scott Kenefake will preach at 8:30 a.m. and 11 a.m. in the sanctuary and at 9:45 a.m. in the Lingle Chapel.

We are living in fearful and anxious times—people are worried about everything from political instability (both here and abroad) to school shootings to decades of stagnant incomes and growing income inequality to deteriorating race relations. Building on Claire's excellent sermon last week on "walls" and "shalom" (peace), Dr. Kenefake will reflect on Luke 24:36b–48—another post—resurrection appearance of Jesus to his disciples—and the "peace" he offers to them and us in a sermon titled, "Faith in an Age of Fear." He'll explore why "fear–based religion" actually compounds these problems and offer a "hope–based" vision for living in turbulent times that is rooted in scripture and the life–example of Jesus himself.
