Community Missions at DCPC

In 2016 the Community Missions Committee reviewed the process used to allocate benevolence funding. There are four basic areas that we focus on; 1) Hunger, 2) Housing, 3) Healthcare, & 4) Children. The local non-profit agencies we support typically have some connection to our church. Examples include church members who serve or work for a local non-profit, and/or members & church staff who volunteer with an agency. Our community is defined as the towns & neighborhoods where the members of DCPC live, work, and serve, with the focus being on the general Lake Norman Region.

Each agency that receives funding must submit an application each year that is reviewed by the committee to determine their suitability (Agency requests must be submitted to the church office by the end of September). Our ability to fund agency requests is based on the amount of funds established by the Session for local benevolences during their annual budgeting process. In 2016 48% of the Community Missions local benevolence budget went to three agencies; 1) Davidson Housing Coalition, 2) Ada Jenkins Center, & 3) Crisis Assistance Ministry.

This Volunteer Opportunities booklet lists many of the agencies we support along with a brief description of their ministry and contact information. On the last page of the booklet you'll find the 2016 Community Missions Budget approved by the Session. The Community Missions Committee would like to make sure that everyone at DCPC has the opportunity to be actively serving in our community. In April 2014, the Session of DCPC voted to enter into a partnership with Blythe Elementary School. We are happy to be following in the footsteps of our theological forebear, John Calvin, who founded an academy for the children of Geneva out of his deeply held belief in the importance of universal education. Catherine Bragg and Rosemary Klein are the co-chairs of the effort and have met with other enthusiastic volunteers to establish the partnership. They are excited to report that there is something that every single person at DCPC can do to plug into helping the wonderful children at this school. Some members work on a regular basis in the classroom with small groups or reading with individual children; many families contribute food during the summer for Blythe students who do not have enough to eat; some members help provide special breakfasts or lunches for the teachers to thank them for their efforts; there are many one-time needs that our members fill, such as cataloging books, being a guest reader in a classroom, helping to plant a garden, or assisting with the book fair. Community Missions Annual Report

In 2015 the Community Missions Committee focused on these activities and accomplished these goals:

- ~ With a budget of \$141,000, the committee sent donations to 25 local agencies and funded 9 in-house projects.
- ~ The Session allocated \$6,300 from the 2014 surplus to the Community Missions Committee that allowed us to fund an additional 3 agencies to bring the total number of agencies supported to 28.
- ~ Started using the video screen in the Chapel to post information prior to the service about our various upcoming events and opportunities. This is part of our ongoing effort to improve communications with the congregation. We also regularly updated the C.M. bulletin board in the hallway and submitted monthly articles in Steepletalk.
- ~ Recruited and supplied volunteers for many organizations in our area, including Loaves & Fishes, LEARN Works at Ada Jenkins, Amigos de Cristo, the Mooresville Soup Kitchen, Crisis Assistance Ministry, Barium Springs, Habitat for Humanity, Davidson Cornelius Child Development Center, Room In the Inn, the Davidson Housing Coalition and HAMMERS, Levine & Dickson Hospice House, and others.
- ~ Continued to support our partnership with Blythe Elementary School (B.E.S.T.) which included the building of raised planting beds at the school and various tasks focused on teacher appreciation – Co-chairs of subcommittee – Catherine Bragg and Rosemary Klein.
- ~ Completed our first Interfaith Build with Habitat by joining Lake Forest Baptist Church, Davidson Presbyterian Church, Grace Covenant Church, and Community in Christ Church to build the Habitat House. More than 35 of our congregation volunteered over 250 hours to assist Dawn Minister build her house. Through the committees fund raising efforts we were able to contribute \$25,000 toward the construction cost of the house.
- ~ Entered into discussion with Habitat for Humanity to participate in the Wildcat build in Feb. 2016 with students at Davidson College. Agreed to set a fund raising goal of \$25,000 for our Habitat Home build account for 2016.
- ~ Collected and delivered food, hygiene and paper products each week for Loaves and Fishes. Also purchased and delivered hygiene supplies to Loaves and Fishes quarterly.

- ~ Collected 10 Cents A Meal each month for a total of approx. \$6,500 (includes the monies collected for Souper Bowl for Car-ing.)
- ~ Hosted Room in the Inn for 7 nights as part of our partnership with Urban Ministries of Charlotte thanks in part to the new volunteer coordinators that were put in place by Chair Richie King.
- ~ Recruited volunteers to make and serve lunch at the Mooresville Soup Kitchen on the fourth Wednesday each month, feeding approximately 150-200 folks per month.
- ~ Hosted 3 DCPC Blood Drives --- February, June and October --- 169 pints collected.
- ~ Supplied volunteers for Amigos de Cristo's tutoring, Vacation Bible School, and the Christmas Party.
- ~ Provided a Camp Experience at Camp Grier (a Presbyterian camp), for 7 children in the Davidson area, who would not otherwise, be able to attend a camp.
- ~ Recruited cooks to make meals for Levine & Dickson Hospice House families on Tuesdays and Thursday throughout the month of July.
- ~ Planned and carried out our 12th Annual Day of Service on November 7th providing more than 180 DCPC volunteers to work on special projects at over 20 different projects at 18 agencies.
- ~ Collected digital applications for benevolence funding from 27 agencies. Using these applications and our priorities of children, health, food, and housing, the committee set a budget for 2016.
- ~ Met with New Member Classes quarterly to welcome them and share with them the opportunities within the Community Missions Committee.
- ~ Planned and implemented the donated food portion of the Christmas Pageant Food Drive on Dec. 13th, by collecting and distributing more than 90 hams plus 62 bags of food and more than 20 cases of canned goods and boxed foods donated by the congregation to the Loaves and Fishes Food Pantry in Davidson.
- ~ In 2015 we provided spontaneous mission opportunities called 'Flash Mob Mission' projects that brought people together to help others in our community and spread Christ's love.
- ~ Raised funds and awareness for the needs of SC Flood victims. We put together 8 PDA Clean-Up Buckets that were sent to SC and began plans for a Disaster Response trip.
- ~ Published an updated *Volunteer Opportunities* brochure for the general use of the members of the congregation outlining the agencies DCPC supports with its benevolence and the opportunities the agencies have for members to volunteer.
