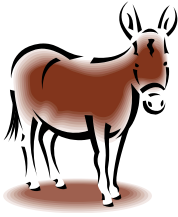


LIVESTOCK AUCTION

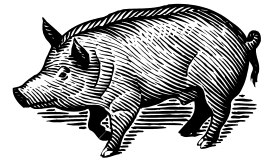
Animals for the auction must be delivered to the Rockingham County Fairgrounds on Friday between 7 a.m. and 12 p.m. of the auction weekend. The animals will be sold in the order they are delivered to the fairgrounds with the sale beginning at 6:30 p.m. A devotional period is held 15 minutes prior to the sale. The livestock committee works very hard to conclude the auction by 9:00 p.m. All buyers are encouraged to remove all livestock immediately after the sale.



Desired are good quality beef/dairy livestock, swine, sheep, goats, donkeys, horses and poultry. For safety reasons, please provide good natured animals only—no wild or unruly animals will be sold. All sheep and goats need flock ID numbers for the Scrapie program. Horses must be Coggins tested and all paper work must accompany the horse. Please bring poultry in a cage that a buyer can carry them home in.



We look forward to working with you as we continue to make every year a successful sale. It is time to begin planning what you will do to help victims of disasters. We need your help to donate animals or to bid on animals.
