The Gulfport, Mississippi area has an old armory that has been renovated and can accommodate approximately 400 people. The coordinator told me that they only wanted "skilled" workers.


The headquarters for Rebuild New Orleans is located in the old World Trade Center in downtown New Orleans. There is a tremendous amount of work to be done in this area.

Dan Lewis, of Prattville, Alabama, met with the folks at Calvary Baptist Church Wednesday, February 28th. They plan to dry this building (9,000 sq. ft.) in during the week of June 11th. Additional help will be needed after they leave.

I've met with Rosemary Baptist Church just out of Williston recently. They are considering building a 3,200 sq. ft. fellowship hall. No final decision at this time. At the present time I cannot say what manpower may be available this summer. If you plan to build and use volunteers to assist you—WE NEED TO MEET.
