FROM THE PASTOR

The last verse of the second chapter of Luke gives us the only clue we have of Jesus' life between the ages of 12 and 30 – the verse says that “Jesus increased in wisdom and stature and in favor with God and man.”

Let's look at each one individually. Jesus grew in wisdom, or mentally. Of course this does not mean just facts and data, it means that Jesus grew in the “mindset” of God. When we have wisdom, we look at life from God's point of view; it is a life of obedience. Then we ask ourselves, “Am I growing this way?”

Second, Jesus grew in stature. He obviously grew physically from a boy to a man; however this implies much more. He grew into the man we know as Jesus. A real man models himself after Jesus. In fact, a real man mirrors the Lord in his actions and his deportment, to the best of his ability.

Third, Jesus grew in favor with God. He grew spiritually. His was a life of total obedience. We must examine our life to see if we are making progress in the area of sanctification. Am I becoming more Christ-like with each passing day?

Fourth, Jesus grew in favor with man. He grew socially. We are to love the brethren. If we love our brothers and sisters in Christ, we will want to be with them and worship with them weekly.

As we look at the life of Jesus from age 12 to 30, we see these patterns in his journey. As we pause at this time to reflect on the life of Jesus, His growth should be the goal of ours.

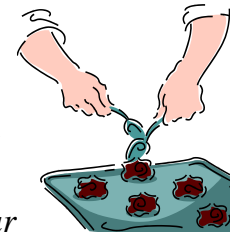
