FROM THE PASTOR

Every preacher has the same dilemma – where do I get my sermons for next Sunday, and the next, and the next.

When I was a seminary pastor, pasturing in Indiana, I bought a “minister’s manual” that had three texts for each Sunday. There was an Old Testament text, one from the gospels, and one from the letters. So I had to preach from one of three passages. In many ways this was good discipline. I could not dodge difficult passages because I was locked in every Sunday.

Charles Spurgeon tells the story of finding the first Sunday of the year’s sermon from the Christmas card of a friend: “For several years I have thankfully received the text of the first Sabbath in the year from a venerable clergyman of a church in the suburbs of London. Spared by a gracious Providence, my good brother has sent me two verses for my subject with his Christmas greetings.”

A preacher finds sermon ideas everywhere. But an expository preacher must ground the sermon idea with a text of scripture. Then he interprets the text and expands its meaning. Not long after leaving the seminary, I began reading the Bible with a legal pad nearby. I was reading primarily for personal edification, but I kept my eyes peeled for sermon texts. As I read, the Holy Spirit would say, “Here is a future sermon.”

A man could preach for a millennium and never fail to find a fresh sermon. It is a thrill and an awesome responsibility to break the bread of heaven each week.
