FROM THE PASTOR

Starting this Sunday night, July 27, I will be teaching Charles Stanley's book *Landmines in the Path of the Believer*. Stanley lists nine "landmines" or hidden dangers in the life of the believer: pride, jealousy, insecurity, compromise, unforgiveness, disappointment, fear, immorality, and laziness. We will discuss these in order, beginning with the subject of pride.

Stanley says: "You must settle two things. First, God is greater than any weapon Satan can bring against you. No matter how horrendous Satan's attack may seem, God is all-powerful. Second, to conquer these sins, you must acknowledge that God has forbidden each one. They are landmines that have been laid in your path, but they do not have to lead to your destruction."

I recommend that you buy and read this book. I hope you can join us on Sunday night as we begin exploring the "landmines" that Satan puts in our pathway.
