Consider the many different ways to gather a group of world-changing women:

Online

- Form an online community to discuss any one of the components such as Holy Space, Secret Place, Face to Face or Take Note.
- Make a link to myMISSION on your MySpace, Facebook, or other online community profile. Invite others to make comments.
- As you blog or email, share the information you are learning from the site and ask others to join in the virtual conversation.

In Your Community

- Invite women in your professional world to come together to discuss a common interest on the site.
- Invite women in your neighborhood together to discuss a common interest. For example, if you meet regularly with other young moms, bring recipes you find or money tips from Money S.O.S.
- Gather regularly with a group and go see one of the movies or read one of the books together. Decide what times for getting together work best. After you meet together for a while, you may want to incorporate items from other aspects of the site, like Holy Space or Face to Face.

In Your Church

- Become a group that does missions projects together. Join other missions groups in your church for churchwide projects.
- Use the social justice articles to plan an activity or an event that creates awareness and gives avenues for advocacy.
- Check out the missions opportunities portion of the site to see what MissionsFEST and International Initiatives have to offer.
- Link your group up with existing missions groups. Work together with the Women on Mission leadership.
