Media Center

General Office Volunteers

Building Upkeep

People who volunteer to assist in minor painting, building repairs as needed or to offer minor repairs to homes of members who are unable to secure someone or financially afford someone to assist them.

MUSIC

Adult Choir

Children

Children's Sunday School

Children's Sunday School includes age-appropriate Bible learning classes for grades 1-5. Through open Bibles, a variety of activities, songs, and conversations, we lead our children from the foundation that has been laid in the preschool area toward a more personal relationship with God. We believe that every teacher of children is a vessel through whom God will pour His truth into the lives of children. Preschool Sunday School

Preschool Sunday School includes age-appropriate Bible learning classes for infants through age 5. We believe that teaching that is done with preschoolers is foundational and vitally important. Mission Friends

Mission stories, crafts about other countries where the gospel is told, fun learning activities to make telling others about Jesus real to young children--that is what the Mission Friends is all about! The ages range from babies to age 5, the time is Wednesday night, and the subject is always missions. We study about missionaries and the many different ways and places they tell others about Jesus. We also encourage the children to begin missions of their own, such as bringing food for a food shelter or small items to go in a shoe box for a needy child. Mission Friends leaders have the advantage of dressing in their jeans and getting down on the floor with the kids to teach them about missions. We do as many hands-on activities as possible to help the children remember the missionaries. Royal Ambassadors (RA's)

RA's currently meets on Wednesday evenings from 6:30-7:30 p.m. and has classes for boys in grades 1-5. This missions group challenges boys in many ways including Bible Study, Bible verse memorization, arts and crafts, and community work. Preschool & Children's Discipleship Training

Sunday evenings at First Baptist is a time for discipling and spiritual growth. In the children's area, there are a variety of experiences that provide nurturing and growth to a more complete understanding of God and His love for us. YOUTH

Youth Sunday School Teacher

The Youth Sunday School teacher is someone called, with a passion to reach young people. He or she is more than someone who just shows up on Sunday morning to teach the youth. They are someone who spends time with, writes cards to, and calls the students under their influence. These are the actual youth ministers who cultivate lasting relationships with life-changing results in the young person's life. Sunday School Teacher Sub

This person has less responsibility than the teacher. They may choose to be in the Sunday School class week in and week out, but do not have teaching responsibility unless the teacher(s) are not able to be in Sunday School. We will try to have at least 2 weeks notice so they can prepare for class. This person has a choice to be involved in the youth ministry, as they want. Youth Sunday School Department Director

This person, although not a teacher, is to see that each teaching position is covered during the Sunday School hour. They give announcements, take prayer requests, and promote upcoming youth events and activities. They also work with the department teachers to see that Sunday School fellowships happen at least once a month. **Contact: Johnny Caruso**

Youth Sunday School Secretary/Outreach

This person is vital to the department and the overall growth of the Youth Sunday School. It is important that we keep good records. Each person who comes through the doors of our Sunday School represents a person that is on a narrow road or the broad road to destruction. We too often take for granted that the students who come are kids who have it all together. This person makes sure every student that is not a member of our Sunday School fills out a visitor's slip. Until they become a member, this will assure that we don't miss anyone or think that we have information about that student in our office. They are also responsible for reminding the teachers when a student becomes delinquent in attendance. Youth Committee Member

A Youth Committee member is a person that commits to the Youth Ministry for a term of 3 years. The committee meets once a month. For the most part there is no cost to the adult. This is an entry-level position that could give evidence to the adult and the Youth Minister if the adult would be a good fit for the Youth Ministry. **Contact: Johnny Caruso**

Youth Events/Trips Drivers

These are persons who volunteer to drive on trips, however this is not their only responsibility. They would also, according to the trip, be going as an adult sponsor. **Contact: Johnny Caruso**
