FMU is named in honor of South Carolina's Revolutionary War hero, General Francis Marion, who was nicknamed the "Swamp Fox," for using the terrain to out-fox the British. Located about seven miles east of Florence, in the beautiful northeast section of South Carolina, the 300-acre campus is about 90 miles from the state capital of Columbia, 60 miles from the shores of Myrtle Beach, and 180 miles from the mountains of the Carolinas.



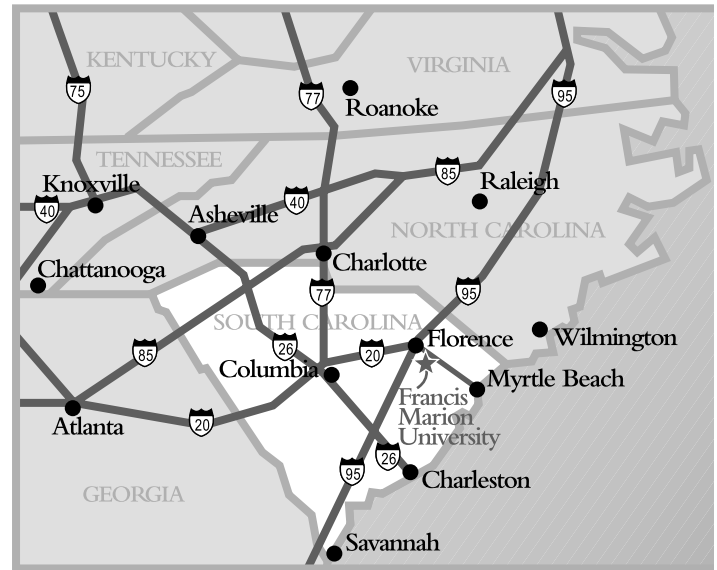
Francis Marion University placed 61 student athletes, including 11 women's soccer players, on last year's Peach Belt Conference Presidential Honor Roll (minimum 3.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale during the academic year), 35 percent of all our student athletes. FMU also placed 88 student athletes, including 11 women's soccer players, on its own Swamp Fox Athletic-Academic Honor Roll.

Francis Marion University 2003 Head Coach



Marty Beall - FMU Women's Soccer Coach

Marty Beall begins his first year as the head women's soccer coach at Francis Marion University. Beall, 29, has been an assistant coach at FMU for the past four seasons.

Beall takes over the head coaching reigns from former head coach Murray Hartzler, who established the women's soccer program in 1995. Hartzler directed the Patriot women to a 109-35-4 all-time record and two invitations to the NCAA Division II national tournament.

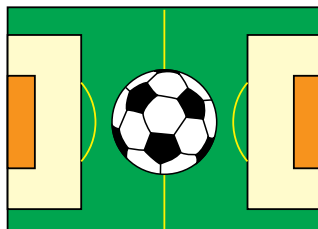
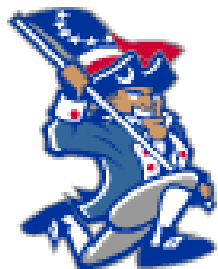
Prior to moving to South Carolina in 1999, Beall spent two seasons as women's assistant coach at the College of Notre Dame in Baltimore, Md.

Beall played two seasons at the University of Maryland-Eastern Shore, where he captained the 1994 squad. He also played one season for a nationally ranked team at Montgomery (Junior) College in Rockville, Md. He completed degree requirements for the B.S. degree in psychology at FMU.

He was an all-state performer as a senior at Damascus (Md.) High School, and played eight seasons with the Bethesda Soccer Club. Beall has also coached at the youth league, high school, and club levels, and is in his fourth year as head coach of the South Carolina Youth-17 Olympic Development Program (ODP) boys' squad. He holds advanced national diplomas from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America.

"This is an exciting time for me," Beall said. "Because I have been here for several years, I am familiar with the program and the change-over will not be anything major. We have a great group of student-athletes, and talented players tend to take the pressure off of a coach. They will make my new job much easier. I am looking forward to this new opportunity."

This past season, with Beall handling a majority of the coaching duties, the Francis Marion women posted a 12-6-1 record. The 2003 squad will return eight of 11 starters. In their previous eight seasons, the Patriot women own a 109-35-4 mark. FMU has never had a losing season and the Patriots have twice earned invitations to the NCAA Division II national tournament.

FMU 2003 Women's Soccer Pre-Season Outlook

Speed - How Far Can They Go ?

First-year Francis Marion University women's soccer head coach Marty Beall is looking forward to the 2003 season like a child on Christmas morning - with a bright smile. "I am very excited about this squad. We have a tremendous amount of talent and youth, and we have incredible speed. This is by far the most athletic and quickest squad that I have seen in my five years at FMU"

Beall, an assistant coach for the past four years, takes over the head coaching reigns from Murray Hartzler, which will allow Hartzler to concentrate on the men's program and his athletic director duties. Hartzler established the women's program in 1995 and guided the Patriot women to a 109-35-4 mark and two NCAA Division II national tournament appearances.

Beall welcomes back nine letterwinners, including eight starters, from last season's 12-6-1 squad that reached the semifinals of the Peach Belt Conference Tournament. Four of the team's losses were by one goal and the two others were to nationally ranked opponents.

FMU will open its 2003 slate on Aug. 30 at Lenoir-Rhyne College. The team's 18-match schedule includes eight home matches, highlighted by the FMU Invitational on Sept. 6-7. The Patriots were picked to finish third according to the PBC coaches' preseason poll.

Leading the returnees are the team's two seniors: midfielder Katie Roberts and back Jessica Skarzinski. Last season, Roberts was the PBC Player of the Year (for the second time in her career) and an All-America selection for her efforts both on the field and in the classroom. With career totals of 35 goals scored, 28 assists, and 98 total points, she is on pace to smash the team all-time records for goals (needs five), assists (needs two), and total points (needs two). Skarzinski, a two-time All-Region player, is sidelined with a broken foot and her return is slated for late September.

Sophomore All-Region forward Katie Riley – also the 2002 PBC Freshman of the Year - returns to bolster a strong front attack. As a freshman, Riley tallied 15 goals and three assists. Joining her at the forward spots will be junior Lauren Cunningham, a transfer from Division I University of Maryland-Baltimore County. In two seasons at UMBC, she scored 10 goals with eight assists. Beall commented, "Lauren is a proven Division I scorer with speed who will partner well with Katie Riley. She will make it difficult for defenses to focus on the two 'Katie's'."

Roberts' switch from a forward position to the center midfield this season is a move designed to give the squad an attacking force from the midfield. "Katie (Roberts) is playing the best soccer of her life," Beall said. "She is a special type of player that only comes along once in a decade. Despite all the numbers she has produced, she is a team player and is willing to do whatever it takes to win."

Joining Roberts in the midfield will be sophomore Mollie Jones, juniors Cyprian Gillingham and Kristi Eyler, sophomore Holly Crow (a transfer from Concord College), and freshman Joey Lee (Irmo, SC). Beall was especially pleased with Lee's preseason work and indicated that the first-year player would see action at the outside midfield positions.

At the back positions, Beall pointed to sophomore Kate Anderson, who started 17 matches last year, junior Nicki Fell, a transfer who played two seasons (32 matches) at Division I Middle Tennessee State University, and freshmen Brittany Rothenbach (Bel Air, MD) and Jody Rhoderick (Middletown, MD). Beall added that Rothenbach's play has lessened the impact of the loss of Skarzinski. "She has worked extremely hard in the preseason and done an outstanding job despite just learning the collegiate game."

In goal, Beall must replace departed All-PBC keeper Amanda Liles. Currently junior Jamie Gustason, who allowed no goals in 105 minutes (two matches) last season, and junior Jackie Bateman, a transfer from Limestone College, are battling for the starting nod. Bateman posted a 1.74 goals against average with six shutouts for Limestone in 2002. "Both are training at a high level and I would feel comfortable with either in goal. The pleasant thing is that both have been very supportive of each other in this battle, which has made them both better players."

Beall suggested his biggest concern entering the 2003 campaign would be giving up counter-attack goals. "We are so dynamic in going forward, we must be able to make the transition back to a defensive posture quickly. Both our conference and region have gotten tougher so every match will be a battle."

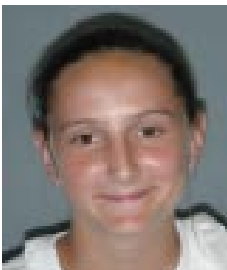

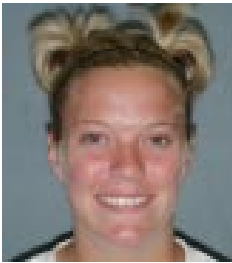

FMU SOCCER FIELD

The FMU Soccer Field is home to both the Francis Marion men's and women's squads. The field, with a seating capacity of 300 is located behind the Smith University Center at the southern end of the campus. To reach the field, enter Gate 4 and park in either of the right-hand or left-hand parking lots. The university has added several features to the field over the past few years, including a new scoreboard and fencing around the field.



The Patriot men's team owns an all-time home mark of 105-89-15 (.538), while the Patriot women are 60-8-2 (.871) all-time on the FMU Soccer Field. The FMU Soccer Field has

hosted the Peach Belt Conference Men's Tournament Final Four three times (1993, 2000, and 2002). The field hosted two NCAA Division II National Men's Tournament matches in 2000, including an Elite Eight (national quarterfinals) match, and in 1998 was the host to a first-round NCAA women's tournament first-round match.

The field also hosted an exhibition match between Francis Marion and the Trinidad and Tobago national team in 1990. The Trinidad and Tobago squad trained at FMU for a couple of days prior to playing a match against the U.S. national team in North Carolina. Prior to building the current field, the Patriot men's team played its home matches on the university's Cornell (baseball) Field, which at that time included an astroturf infield.

PBC



Francis Marion University is a member of the 12-school NCAA Division II Peach Belt Conference (formerly the Peach Belt Athletic Conference). Other PBC members include Armstrong Atlantic State University (in Savannah, Ga.), Augusta State University (Augusta, Ga.), Clayton College & State University (Morrow, Ga.), Columbus State University (Columbus, Ga.), Georgia College & State University (Milledgeville, Ga.), Kennesaw State University (Kennesaw, Ga.), Lander University (Greenwood, S.C.), UNC Pembroke, University of North Florida (Jacksonville, Fla.), USC Aiken, and USC Spartanburg. Formed in December 1989 and headquartered in Augusta, Ga., the PBC conducts championships in 12 sports, six for men and six for women. Only eight of the Peach Belt members sponsor women's soccer. The 2003 PBC women's soccer tournament will be held Nov. 4, 7-8 at sites of the higher seeds.
