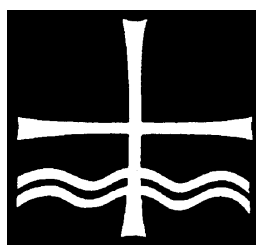


Spiritual Direction Referral List
